To Settle Public Lands in Washington, D. C., Dept. of the Interior

A curious corporation in Brazil has the name of the "Companhia Nova Erual De Brazil," with a capital of \$25,000,000, a large part of which has been furnished by bankers and local investors. The object of this corporation is to establish twenty agricultural settlements upon the public lands of Brazil, which are given free by the government to aid the people to construct lines of railway, to carry out other engineering and mining operations and the manufacture of sugar, bricks, tiles, lime and other articles, for export as well as for local consumption. These colonies will be divided into villages and considered the estate as the nucleus for their development. The federal and several state governments of Brazil have offered
