The JOURNAL does not have to tell what it has done for the county or what it can do. The contents of its columns tell as to the first point and we are willing to let results tell as to what is accomplished.

The sixth annual session of the north Nebraska teachers' association will be held at Norfolk, March 30 and 31 and April 1. An interesting program has been prepared. A rate of one and one third fare for the round trip has been made by the railroads.

The remarks of Loran Clark, of Boone county, at the recent meeting of the state central committee were quite interesting to those who recall the action of Rosewater when Clark was a candidate for state treasurer a few years ago. Opportunities usually come to him who waits and Clark has been waiting for a good while.

The emperor of Germany does not appear to be on the best of terms with the people. Rioting is being indulged in by a great number of people and a few days ago while the emperor was out riding on horseback he received a warning which caused him to take a closed carriage and go by way of the back streets and sneak into the back door of his home. He has been hooted at, a thing which has not occurred before since 1848. The situation is viewed with grave apprehension by the emperor and his adherents and what the outcome will be cannot be foretold. It begins to look as if sovereigns in Europe would exist only in history.

An appeal was taken from the action of the county commissioners of Lawrence county on the allowance of \$3 per day and mileage to county commissioners. Judge Bartow held that there is no law at present on the statute books for allowing the same. The title of the bill in which the repealing clause was passed does not contain any mention of section 22 of chapter 28 of the statutes, and under the well established rule of the constitution and the courts that would vitiate that part of the bill, but whether the constitutionality of the bill was raised in the case passed on or not the report does not state. It is likely to be made a test case and carried to the supreme court.

Some of our exchanges are talking of a delegate to the national convention from the northwest part of the state. That would be a very nice thing but there is no use attempting to get something that is beyond reach. The northwest is as yet thinly settled and cannot go backed by the votes necessary for such things. It would be about the same as for Wyoming to claim a presidential nominee. It would be far better for the northwest to wait until it is more thickly settled and go into a contest with a good show of securing whatever recognition is sought than to go in too early and get left. Let's get the northwest settled up in good shape and then a great deal can be accomplished, and no one need be sacrificed.

The leaders of the republican party in the strongest parts of the sixth congressional district express themselves as being in favor of no locality and no hobby, but the best and strongest man for the place on the ticket. There are a number of strong, able men in the district and if that kind of a sentiment prevails there is no question but what a good choice will be made when the time comes. If there is no machine work allowed there is no question as to what the result will be. Nebraska will not be in the doubtful column unless some aspirants and would-be bosses take such action as will disgust the rank and file of the party. It would be an excellent plan for any who feel like forcing themselves on the party to take the advice of Woolsey and "fling away ambition" and help the party regain what it has lost.

Of all the questions that have for years come before congress not one has assumed the shape of the free silver agitation. Of course the wealth of the land, that is the circle known as the "gold bugs," do not want the volume of currency increased, while the masses desire to see the volume of the circulating medium increased as much as it can be and still be on a sound basis, and in addition to those the inflationists who claim that anything bearing the guarantee of the government should be made money, balance the position of the "gold bugs." The contest is not marked by party lines, locality or anything else. It is made up of opinions of men from all classes and in all walks of life and promises to be one of the most difficult questions to settle that has been before the public for years. The west, especially wants more money, but it is good money that is wanted and that is the rock on which opinion has split.

Mrs. Brown, mother of Mrs. Senator Manderson, died at the home of the latter in Washington on Feb. 29th, at the age of 71 years. She had been sick for some time. The remains were taken to Canton, Ohio, for interment.

It is reported that the B & M. will push its Buffalo line across the Big Horn basin to the national park and thence to the Pacific coast. The Elkhorn will have to get a hustle on itself or what was supposed to be its territory by right of priority will be captured by its competitor.

The *Nebraska Pulse* is the name of a new paper just started at Alliance by Cotton & Pevar and is to be conducted in the interests of the advantages possessed by northwest Nebraska. All such enterprises help to build up the country and THE JOURNAL wishes the newspaper abundant success.

The latest reports from Casper, Wyo., are that rich zinc deposits have recently been discovered. A man found the stuff and did not know what it was and on investigation learned that he had made a valuable find. Our neighboring state gives promise of being what has been claimed—the richest mineral country in the world.

A few days ago Gov. Boyd appointed Dr. Charles A. Manning superintendent of the insane hospital. It is asserted that he is not legally qualified under the laws of the state to fill the position. It is not questioned that he is competent to fill the place, but he has no diploma and hence has not complied with the requirements of the state law.

The action of the *Bee* toward Tom Majors does not look as if Rosewater intended to help bring about republican success in the coming campaign. If the people want Majors, Omaha should give him a hearty support. All admit that Omaha is a pretty big factor in politics, but it should not persist in being a rule or ruin factor. The state outside of Omaha is entitled to some recognition and this is no year for dissensions.

Among the many things that give rise to a complicated situation in politics is the idea that prevails to a great extent among newspaper circles that they must boom any official who gets a bee in his bonnet in order to hold his good will and receive the patronage he has to bestow. This fact brings out a great many men at every convention who are backed by some small local following, thus increasing the number of corners to the contest and resulting in no good to the various aspirants and a tendency to weaken the party on account of bad blood growing out of the defeat of the many and the success of the one who is the victor. Those who desire to see republican success should use every effort to diminish rather than increase the number of candidates. What is the use of leading a man to think he has a dead cinch on the nomination for an office when there is no reasonable grounds for such a claim?

The new editor of the *Herald* made some statements in the last issue of his paper which caused people to smile. He said that ever since the *Herald* was established it has worked diligently without swerving for one moment, for the upbuilding of the town and county, and the advancement of the noble principles of republicanism. He evidently has not looked up the contents of that paper in the past and is not as well posted as the people of Sioux county on that point. He probably does not know about the *Herald* in 1888 "whooping it up" for Cleveland and Thurman (that was before it flopped in order to get lead office patronage) and he does not know that less than a year ago his *Herald* was advising against urging new settlers to come here to locate. He should devote a little time to reading the files of his paper, for if he continues to make such statements as those referred to he will soon have as well-established a reputation in Sioux county as had his predecessor.

A few days ago Capt. A. D. Yocum, ex-mayor of Hastings, shot and killed Myron Van Fleet on the streets of that city. It seems that the latter had circulated a story to the effect that a daughter of Yocum had eloped with a colored coachman, and that such report was false. Yocum was absent from home at the time, on his return heard of the matter and proceeded to shoot the being who had attempted to disgrace the name of his daughter. The punishment was severe, but it should teach people that it is not safe to attack the reputation of a woman. Under the present rules of society a woman has nothing if she has not a good name and people are willing to believe almost anything against them and it is right that fathers and brothers jealously guard the reputation of their daughters and sisters and as there is no law that will adequately reach and punish the thing, bearing the likeness of a man but lacking the essentials of manhood, which attempts to fasten a stain on the reputation of a woman it becomes almost necessary for such action as that taken by Capt. Yocum. A few years ago a pretended doctor was shot in the court room at Hastings for debauching a little girl, a brother of the girl firing the shot, and the public said it was a righteous deed, and it looks very much as if the verdict of the masses would be the same in regard to the shooting of Van Fleet.

## Revised Orthography.

English spelling is the worst in the world. Millions of dollars are wasted each year in the writing and printing of useless letters. The education of our people is hampered by our cumbersome, illogical, misleading orthography. The scholarship of the world is almost a unit in demanding a change. The American Philological Association has recommended the following rules for new spellings:

1. Drop *u* at the end of words like dialogue, catalogue, etc., where the preceding vowel is short. Thus spell demagog, synagog, epilog, etc.
  2. Drop final *e* in such words as definite, infinite, favorite, etc., where the preceding vowel is short. Thus spell opposite, preterit, hypocrit, requisit, etc.
  3. Drop final *te* in words like quartette, coquette, cigarette, etc. Thus spell cigaret, roset, ppaulet, vadet, gazet, etc.
  4. Drop the final *m* in words like programme. Thus spell program, oriflam, gram, etc.
  5. Change *ph* to *f* in words like phantom, telegraph, please, etc. Thus spell alfabet, paragraf, filosofy, fonetic, fotograf, etc.
  6. Substitute *c* for the diphthongs *oe* and *ou* when they have the sound of that letter. Thus spell eolan, esthetic, diarchen, subpona, esofagus, atheneum, etc.
- If you would array yourself on the side of progress, adopt the foregoing in all that you write, and especially in all that you print.
