The Verdict.

PITTSBURG, Aug. 5.—The inquests into the deaths resulting from the riots at Homestead was concluded before Coroner McDowell.

In his opening remarks the coroner reviewed for what purpose the jury had been elected and sworn, and recited what his duty consists of when called to act on sudden deaths.

At 4:10 the verdict was rendered. The return in the cases of seven strikers who were killed reads almost alike in each one.

NO ATTEMPT was made by the jury in any of the cases to designate the persons by whom the fatal shots were fired, further than to declare that there was an unlawful assemblage on the Carnegie property which led to a battle.
