**COMMISSIONERS' RECORD.**  
 (Official.)  
 HARRISON, NEB., Oct. 4, 1922.  
 Board of county commissioners met in session.  
 Present—Commissioners F. W. Knott and M. J. Weber, and clerk.  
 Minutes of last meeting read and, on motion, approved.  
 Application entitled E. E. Brewster vs. Mar Gayhart, county treasurer of Sioux county, Nebraska, and the stipulation and bills thereto attached, was presented to the board, and the board desiring that the same therein contained be a decision of the court, obtained in the manner of a friendly stipulation, respectfully request that the county assessor advise the issuance and service of summons in the matter, and permit it to be brought to the court on the stipulation attached to the petition, the board finding that the matters contained in such stipulation to be true. The stipulation to said application being signed by E. E. Brewster, Mar Gayhart and F. W. Knott and M. J. Weber, county commissioners of Sioux county, Nebraska.  
 Petition of Johann Meier and others against the establishment of a public road commencing at the northwest corner of sec. 21 and the northeast corner of sec. 22, Twp. 24, range 26, thence running south 22 feet between sections 22 and 21 to about 20 rods north of section corner of sec. 22 and southeast of 2, Twp. 24, range 26, thence running west two rods, thence running south 80 rods and thence east, was taken up, and the same was described as was known as a crosscut road, the line described was hereby declared a public road.  
 Official bond of George Albertson as assessor for Sleep Creek precinct was presented and approved.  
 Report of A. Southworth, county superintendent, presented and approved and placed on file.  
 Official bond of H. H. Russell, as road overseer for district No. 12, was presented and approved.  
 Official bond of Jacob Gaupert, as justice of the peace for Sleep Creek precinct, was presented and approved.  
 Official bond of Valentine Thomas, as road overseer for district No. 17, was presented and approved.  
 Petition of B. E. Brewster, praying for the establishment of a public road commencing at southeast corner section 19, Twp. 24, range 26, and running thence one mile and terminating at southeast corner section 20 at junction with county road, was taken up and it being what is known as a crosscut road, the line described was hereby declared a public road.  
 On motion the clerk be and he hereby is directed to advertise for the construction of a bridge across the last dry gulch on section line between sections five and eight, Twp. 24, range 26, in Cottonwood precinct, bridge to be feet high in center, is feet wide and 6 feet long, and specifications to be furnished with bids for either truss or girder bridge, the board to reserve right to accept any and all bids.


