

EDUCATIONAL NOTES.

In New York and Brooklyn, the supply of public school buildings is much less than the demand.

A bill has been introduced in the legislature of Wisconsin, which if carried, will give a pension to teachers in the public schools. This is a move in the right direction

A bill has been introduced in the legis ature of New Jersey, asking the State to aid all private school that comply with certain conditions.

St. Louis recently held the twentieth anniversary of the establishment of its first kindergarten. The event was celebrated in a befitting manner, in connection with the formal opening of the public library building.

The semi-annual apportionment of the school fund to the various counties of the State was completed last week by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The total amount of money so apportioned was \$224,337.60. The pupils entitled to draw from this fund number about 233,685.

A society was recently founded in Germany for promoting education upon the principles advocated by Herbart. The first general meeting was attended by more than two thousand masters. Concerning the training of teachers it was pointed out that Herbart and his followers treated education from the theontical standpoint, as a science. From its practical side as an art.
