The legislature will adjourn tomorrow at noon.

The bounty on sugar and chicory means much to northwest Nebraska.

When Stewart ran his mouth against the rules of the senate he found it to be an uphill job.

The hostilities by Japan against China have been suspended and the probabilities are that peace will soon be concluded. Wars of long duration are things of the past.

The farmers who see in the development of the sugar industry the way to the salvation of a good portion of Nebraska have not had their respect for the governor increased by his veto of the bounty bill.

Nebraska is herself again. Rain or snow fell in liberal quantities all over the state last week and the spirits of the people were greatly elevated thereby. A good crop year will regain for the state much of the prestige it lost in 1894.

The initial number of the *Northwestern War*, published at Crawford by Frank L. Meredith and Wilbert L. Elswick, is at hand. It has for its object the advancement of the agricultural interests of this part of the state. Long may it wave.

Twelve propositions to amend the constitution will be submitted to the voters of the state as one of the results of the session of the legislature which is to expire tomorrow. Those added to the list of candidates will certainly make a blanket ballot necessary.

In the senate when the vote on the passage of the sugar and chicory bounty bill over the veto of the governor was taken two populists voted for its passage, Crawford, of Holt, and Jeffries of Greeley. In the house the bill was on a strict party vote of those voting.

The reports from Minnesota are that the ground is the dryest ever known there at this season of the year. The farmers have been compelled by the opening of spring to put in their crops, but while at work they are continually enveloped in a perfect cloud of dust. With no fall rains, but little snow during the winter and no spring rains the outlook in that state is gloomy.

Some exceptions have been taken to what THE JOURNAL has said about rustlers, and some say that the larger cattle owners are the greater cattle rustlers. So far as this paper is concerned it makes no difference whether a man has two cows or twenty thousand if he steals what does not belong to him he should be held responsible and if any one has proof of it why in the name of justice does he not prosecute? Law should be law alike for rich and poor. THE JOURNAL is for law and justice. It is opposed to persecution and legal forces.

Senator Stewart added considerably to his record for unfitness for the position for which he has been drawing salary on last Thursday by becoming involved in a personal encounter with the sergeant-at-arms of the senate. The senate in committee of the whole was discussing a bill and Stewart in his remarks got out of order. A senator arose to a point of order and the chair recognized him. He rapped with his gavel for Stewart to come to order but that individual did not do so. The rapping was continued fast and furious but Stewart kept his windmill running, when the chairman paused for moment the unruly member shouted "I don't care anything about your point of order." The sergeant-at-arms approached him and he exclaimed "Go away from here." The officer took him by the arm and pushed him toward the chair. Stewart resisted and a struggle ensued. The officer grabbed him by his whiskers. Stewart made a move to strike him when he said in a steady tone "Don't do that or you will get hurt" and the offender evidently realized that he was for the time an outlaw and refrained from striking. Order was finally restored and a resolution was introduced censuring Stewart severely for his action unless he make proper apology. Next day the resolution came up. Stewart attempted to pose as a martyr and to dodge behind the fact that it was in committee of the whole and therefore the presiding officer had no authority to compel him to come to order. That did not satisfy the senators and the resolutions of censure were adopted by a vote of 25 to 5, some of Stewart's best friends voting for it.

### Chicory.

Fremont Tribune. In all probability the production of chicory will be greatly stimulated in Nebraska by the bounty given it by the new bill just passed by the state legislature.

The conditions and amount of the bounty are precisely the same as those governing the sugar bounty. The bounty paid is five-eighths of a cent a pound for the manufactured product to factories now in existence and one cent a pound to those that may be hereafter established within the period for which the bounty runs, which is three years. It is also provided that an additional amount equal to the bounty shall be paid, above the present price, for the roots. There is now only one factory in the state (at O'Neill) but another is projected at Holdrege and will doubtless be speedily built.

Chicory is a root crop easily produced, well suited to a dry climate and will grow readily in nearly all parts of the state. It yields from six to ten tons of roots per acre and this crop will bring at the factories at least \$10.50 per ton, or the factory will not be entitled to the bounty.

Chicory factories for converting the raw produce into the article of commerce can be built for from \$10,000 to \$15,000. Thus it will be seen that the chicory industry is one likely to spread rapidly throughout the state. It requires little capital to handle the business and a factory is within the reach of almost any community in Nebraska where there may be a desire to test the practical value of factories and of an intensive system of farming.

It is not too much to expect that under the new law the chicory business will be given an impetus that will soon make it an important industry in this state.
