The following preamble and resolutions were on motion adopted:

Whereas the assessed valuation of Sioux county Neb., for the year 1895, is but \$475,854 as corrected by the board of equalization, subject however to correction by the clerk, in so far as clerical errors may appear; and Whereas 15 mills levy on \$475,854 will make \$7,128 and the board of county commissioners are only allowed to issue warrants to the amount of 85 per cent of said sum, or warrants for \$6,058 and thereafter resolve that the following items included in the estimate of expenses for the year 1895, viz: District Court expenses, salaries, stationery printing and publishing, incidental expenses, institutional fund, insane fund, poor fund and officers fees be reduced to come within the limit of nine mills on the dollar of the total assessed valuation of Sioux county, for the year 1895.

To produce county revenue for the year 1895 the board hereby make the following levy:

On valuation of \$475,854 for general fund nine mills on the dollar value.

For bridge fund 3 and seven-tenths mills on the dollar value. For road fund 2 mills on the dollar value. For soldiers relief fund two-tenths mills on the dollar value.
