The Rushville Standard predicts a good crop for northwest Nebraska next season. THE JOURNAL did that for many years but has come to the conclusion to its crop predicting after harvest in future.

Alliance has commenced the work of a campaign for the removal of the county seat of Box Butte county to that town from Hemingford. A county seat right is not a pleasant thing but most of Hemingford has moved to Alliance so the seat of government is likely to follow.

Each term of court emphasizes the need of a change in the rules of the court in respect to the rights of the presiding judge. The court should have the right when he knows that an attorney is presenting a pleading certified to be himself, the statements in which are not true for the purpose of defeating or defeating the law, and by certifying them to be guilty of perjury, to immediately call such attorney to account and punish him. ### A Taste of Old Times.

Senator H. G. Stewart has accepted an invitation to do editorial work on the "Crawford Beacon" and the following is one of his editorials:

"We wish to correct a statement made last week by the little chap that runs the concentrated lie factory at Harrison, not on our own account but in behalf of the good people of Sioux and Dawes counties. He says 'we worked them' we wish to say that the people of the Northwest are not the kind to be worked and as proof of the same, let me remind him that during the last five years we have held three political meetings in Sioux Co. and that all the time his little lie factory was running full blast against us at the same time we have carried Sioux county in each election. You see it is not necessary for us to do any political work in territory where your sheet circulates you should know by this that the people of the Northwest can't be 'worked.' No we are going to stay in Dawes county. Holt county does not need us, there are plenty of good straight Populists there to see to it that the thieving old party ever does not again get its hands onto the public funds. The hoodoo gang of hollow box times of Dawes county needs our attention."

The above is quite refreshing and reminds one of the times when Harrison had a paper of the same stripe as that on which Senator Stewart has "accepted an invitation to do editorial work." The arguments produced by him and the reasons therefor are great. The fact that the editor of the "sheet" at Harrison is a "little chap" certainly calls for condemnation at the hands Senator Stewart. Shades of the departed Messerroll! If the editor of the "sheet" at Harrison was as big, physically and mentally, as Mr. Stewart he might have hoodooed the people into electing him to the state senate and got his whiskers pulled by the sergeant-at-arms for defying the presiding officer, and finally have been "invited to do editorial work" on a great paper like the *Beacon*.

Senator Stewart further says the people of the northwest "can't be worked" and as proof of his assertion cites the fact that he has carried it three times in the last five years. It may have slipped the scholarly senator's memory but he first worked the people on the alliance racket and his first delegation from Sioux county was chosen by that organization behind doors guard'd by the grip and password. Two years later his delegation was named in convention and last year the senatorial delegates were opposed to him, but he knew that the people were onto him and had moved into Dawes county, leaving two years' taxes unpaid, and at the polls he carried the county by ONE. At home he plays the role of farmer-at-Lincoln as he has the reputation of being a "high-roller." He has been charged in the press and on the stump with acts of a nature not creditable and has given no satisfactory explanation. He very modestly (Senator Stewart is always modest, even in contest matters) notifies his readers that Dawes county needs him, notwithstanding the fact that the voters at the polls said "different." Senator Stewart is a great man and a profound thinker and the more fact that he has trained his editorial batteries on the "sheet" at Harrison ought to be sufficient to cause the "little chap" who runs it to give up the ghost, but at time of going to press
