—The parties to the suit with their attorney and witnesses appeared at the home of Justice Hunter in Bodare, on last Thursday in the case of Hester & Son against Lindeman. Attorney Guthrie filed a motion to dismiss on the grounds that the records of the county clerk did not show that any such firm existed, and supported his motion by an affidavit of the county clerk. The court sustained the motion and the case was dismissed at the cost of the plaintiff. The statute on the subject provides that persons doing business as a firm shall file certificate to that effect in the office of the county clerk, and failure to do so makes the parties liable to a fine in any sum not to exceed \$1,000, but it is not lived up to by many, but some have taken the precaution to file the necessary papers since attention has been called to it. It is understood that the defeated party will take the case to the district court.

—It is reported that a shooting scrape occurred at one of the ranches on White river a few nights ago, but no one was hurt. A man from that locality expressed the firm opinion that it would be wise for the county board to grant the license as the place will be run anyway. That, in the opinion of the writer, is a wrong position. The fact that such a place was permitted to run some years ago should not be taken as evidence that it will be done again. L. O. Hull is not county attorney and the violators of the law may find to their sorrow that such is the case. The matter of a license will come up before the county commissioners on next Monday and a remonstrance has been filed so that it is not known how it will come out, but THE JOURNAL would advise the parties if they fail to procure a license, they had better move out before they get into trouble.
