The pivotal states are all in the west this year, and they will not be pivotal when they come to decide between a free trade and a protection candidate for president.—Chicago Inter Ocean.

It is announced that early action will be taken in the matter of notifying Bryan and Watson of their having been nominated by the populist national convention. The time and place have not yet been selected.

The democratic state convention of Wyoming declined a proposition from the populists to fuse. Such action by various state democratic organizations go to show that help to elect the Chicago nominee without anything to be given to the populists in return is the object sought.

It does not look at all improbable that Nebraska may furnish a third presidential candidate. The sound money democrats hold their convention on the 2d of September and it looks very much as if the first place will be given to J. Sterling Morton. Nebraska seems to be strictly in line for honors in national politics this year.

The populist congressional convention at Crawford last week was quite an exciting affair and considerable bitterness is reported to have been engendered among the aspirants. The outcome was the nomination of Judge W. L. Green, of Kearney, which is the last chapter of the work of the combination made by Gov. Holcomb, Judge Neville, Judge Green and a few others as to the distribution of nominations. It will be hard work for the supporters of Judge Green to make a fight for their candidate for he is not just the kind of a man honest advocates of reform would like to go before the people with. It is peculiar that the populist party which was organized but a few years and was to be the party of the people, has so soon come to be completely dominated by a few schemers who get all the benefits while the people get nit.

The third in the list of the proposed amendments to the constitution has for its object the regulation of the compensation of the officers of the executive department of the state government, and also to guard against such officials receiving any other reward as payment for the performance of their duties. The rights and interests of the people seem to be well guarded and the proposition seems to be a good. The next proposition is to make it possible for the legislature to create a court, higher than the district court but lower than the supreme court. The ever-increasing number of people and business in the state causes a corresponding increase in the amount of litigation, and unless better court facilities are provided litigants will stand small chance of having their suits adjudicated during their lives. It seems to be a necessary provision. The next provides for the redistricting of the state for judicial purposes and providing more judges when necessary. Like the others it seems to have ample provision for the protection of the people and has for its object the advancement of the public welfare.

The speech of Bryan at Madison Square contained thirteen thousand words, but not one of them referred to the nomination by the populists at St. Louis, and of all the reports of the notification meeting noticed that given by Tom Watson's paper shows it up the least creditable to Watson's running mate. The situation of Bryan, Watson, and Sewall is very peculiar.

Dr. S. R. Raza, editor of the Curtis Colorist, was shot last week by a man with whom he had a misunderstanding. The victim was unarmed and offered no resistance when assaulted upon the street. When a person resorts to other than legal redress, except in self-defense, it is pretty good evidence that he is in the wrong, and this seems to have been the case with the would-be murderer of Dr. Raza. It is not known whether the shots will prove fatal or not.

When a man who believes that a protective tariff is necessary for national industry and prosperity, but who have to some extent lost sight of protection in prominence given the silver question, is making up his mind how to vote, to recall the feeling of Bryan on the question of protection when he said: "Protection is a system of taxation which is legalized robbery, conceived in iniquity and born in fraud and corruption. I do not believe in stopping until the last vestige of protection is eradicated from legislation."

The government is having some trouble letting its contracts for river and harbor improvement, under the continuing contract system. Large contractors are averse to taking contracts for work that is to cost millions of dollars and to employ thousands of men for several years without some understanding as to whether the money they are to receive shall be equal to the money in use when they make their estimates for the work. There is no politics in their action, but simply a business problem growing out of the political situation now before the people.

Ed. Catron, who has a reputation all over this part of the country as a great rustler, was arrested a few days ago by Sheriff McBuskey, of Cheyenne county, Kansas, near St. Francis in that state. The sheriff shot him in the leg and then jumped in and took his rifle from him. Catron is wanted in Sheridan county for stealing seventeen head of cattle at one time, and fourteen at another time, all of which belonged to Richards & Cairns, and he is also wanted in Grist county where he broke jail while awaiting trial on a similar charge. It may be that he will receive his dues this time.

The rate of \$5.50 for the round trip to Omaha and return, including one admission to the state fair, which has been made by the Elkhorn road places the trip within the reach of all who desire to make the trip. It is five hundred miles from Harrison to Omaha and the admission to the fair is fifty cents, so that the railroad fare is but half a cent a mile. No one should miss the chance. The state fair will be the best in the history of the state, and the Elkhorn line is entitled to credit for thus affording the people of the extreme northern corner of the state an opportunity to reach it so cheaply.

Last week Judd Woods stated in his paper, the West Union, Custer county, Gazette, that he probably would get out but one more issue. He says "There seems to have been no well defined provocation for its establishment in the first place and the experience of three years has demonstrated that there is surely none for its continued existence." Judd has conducted a paper which ought to have satisfied the most rampant populist, and that too, in Custer county, the cradle and hot-bed of the party, and the fact that it dies for lack of support right in so important a campaign forces the conclusion that populism must be on the decline, even in Custer county.

It seems that the crimes of the man Cochran, of whose arrest in the south part of Sioux county mention was made last week, were not confined to the rustling of the cattle found in his possession, but included the murder of Paul Rose, the man from whom the cattle were stolen. The body of the murdered man was found so near the line between Nebraska and Colorado that a survey will have to be made to ascertain which of the states the crime was committed in. PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

The following proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, are submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3, A. D. 1896:

A joint resolution proposing to amend sections two (2), four (4), and five (5) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to number of judges of the supreme court and their term of office.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska: Section 1. That section two (2) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows: Section 2. The supreme court shall consist of five (5) judges, one of whom shall be the chief justice, and four (4) associate justices, to be elected for a term of six (6) years, one to be elected for each year, and the term of office shall expire on the first day of January next following the expiration of the term for which they were respectively commissioned.

Section 2. That section four (4) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows: Section 4. The judges of the supreme court shall hold their offices for a term of six (6) years, one to be elected for each year, and the term of office shall expire on the first day of January next following the expiration of the term for which they were respectively commissioned.

Section 3. That section five (5) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows: Section 5. That at the first general election to be held in the year 1896, there shall be elected two (2) judges of the supreme court, one of whom shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, one for the term of four (4) years, and at each general election thereafter, there shall be elected one judge of the supreme court for the term of five (5) years, unless otherwise provided by law. Provided, that the first of the supreme court whose terms have not expired at the time of holding the general election shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which they were respectively commissioned.

Approved March 29, A. D. 1895.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to section thirteen (13) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to compensation of supreme and district court judges.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska: Section 1. That section thirteen (13) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows: Section 13. The judges of the supreme and district courts shall receive for their services as follows: The chief justice, \$10,000 per annum; the associate justices, \$8,000 per annum; the district judges, \$6,000 per annum; and the clerks of the courts, \$4,000 per annum. The compensation shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of each month, and in no event less than thirty days of the month in which the compensation is due.

Section 2. The judges of the supreme and district courts shall receive for their services as follows: The chief justice, \$10,000 per annum; the associate justices, \$8,000 per annum; the district judges, \$6,000 per annum; and the clerks of the courts, \$4,000 per annum. The compensation shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of each month, and in no event less than thirty days of the month in which the compensation is due.

Section 3. The judges of the supreme and district courts shall receive for their services as follows: The chief justice, \$10,000 per annum; the associate justices, \$8,000 per annum; the district judges, \$6,000 per annum; and the clerks of the courts, \$4,000 per annum. The compensation shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of each month, and in no event less than thirty days of the month in which the compensation is due.

Approved March 29, A. D. 1895.

A joint resolution proposing to amend section twenty-four (24) of article five (5) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to compensation of the officers of the executive department.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska: Section 1. That section twenty-four (24) of article five (5) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows: Section 24. The officers of the executive department of the State of Nebraska shall receive for their services as follows: The Governor, \$15,000 per annum; the Lieutenant Governor, \$12,000 per annum; the Secretary of State, \$10,000 per annum; the Auditor, \$8,000 per annum; the Treasurer, \$7,000 per annum; the Attorney General, \$6,000 per annum; the Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings, \$5,000 per annum; the Superintendent of Public Instruction, \$4,000 per annum; the Registrar of the State University, \$3,000 per annum; and the Regent of the State University, \$2,000 per annum. The compensation shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of each month, and in no event less than thirty days of the month in which the compensation is due.

Section 2. The compensation shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of each month, and in no event less than thirty days of the month in which the compensation is due.

Section 2.
