The populists are to hold a meeting at the Monroe school house Saturday evening.

J. H. Brown has leased a place near Cody for a term of years and is moving his stock there.

Judge W. L. Greene, the populist democratic candidate for congress, is bill d to speak in Harrison on Tuesday, October 13th, both in the afternoon and evening.

The populists of the first commissioner district held a convention at Gilchrist last Saturday and nominated S. L. Ellis for commissioner.

Wm. Holden is not so dead as reported. On last Saturday the writer saw him at the Blaine hotel at Hudson. He is not well yet but is in a fair way to recover.

Hon. F. M. Dorrington of Alliance, will address the people on the political issues at the Serpis school house on Monday evening, Oct. 12th. All in that locality should hear him.

Floyd Clark shot himself through the thumb of the right hand with his rifle last Saturday. He had his thumb over the muzzle of the gun and was rubbing his foot along the stock when it discharged. Fortunately the ball did not run the bone.

Harrison did not show up on Tuesday, but Elmer E. Thomas, of Onawa, was here to talk populism to the people. Not many attended and quite a number left before he closed. He made no votes for the side he represented.

The Van Tassell tax case came up on Monday before Judge Wilson and was continued until November 19th. It was necessary for the county to have a certain witness and he could not be obtained in time to proceed with the trial, hence the postponement.

The populists of Warbonnet precinct met on Oct 1st and put up the following precinct ticket: Chas. E. Schiff and John L. Stratton, justices of the peace; James Merriam and E. Lyon, constables; W. J. Lyon, assessor; G. Norness, road overseer; B. F. Thomas and J. Dent, clerks of election; O. A. Garton, James Nolan, and S. Thomas, judges of election. The delegates to the district convention were instructed for S. L. Ellis for Commissioner.

Suit has been filed in the district court against Charles E. Schiff, Charles Kiehl, Isador Richstein and Robert L. Keel by Emma Noreisch for damages in the sum of \$25,000.00. The damage is claimed to have been sustained by reason of the treatment of her husband a few months ago when he was taken out and whipped for mistreating the plaintiff in the case. J. E. Porter, of Crawford, is attorney for the woman. There may be a serious side to the matter, but so far it is considered as a joke.
