OBITUARY.

DIED—At home of her son L. Harrison, on last Sunday afternoon, February the 25th 1900. Mrs. Ellen Griswold, aged 65 years.

The lingering illness of Mrs. Ellen Griswold came to an end last Sunday evening, February 25, 1900, at 5 o'clock when the Grim Reaper came and called her into the great beyond. While her death was not unexpected, yet a flutter of hope lingered to the last, and her passing away is a severe shock to the bereaved ones she leaves behind. For five weeks she had lain stricken with paralysis at the home of her only child, D. H. Griswold, and though all that could be done was being done by the attending physician, the disease gradually tightened its hold until on Friday the victim sunk into utter unconsciousness and immobility remaining in this state to the last.

The first attack of the disease was on last July when, it will be remembered, Mr. and Mrs. Griswold, were summoned to her bedside at her home in Avoca, Iowa. After recovering sufficiently for travel she came here to live and it was hoped that the change would result in her complete recovery, and this hope was seemingly being realized, for she was gradually gaining in health up to the evening on which she was last stricken.

The funeral was held from the home at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon, conducted by Rev. J. A. Schmalhorn, presiding elder, who was summoned from Ma-land. The remains were interred in the Harrison cemetery.

The sympathy of the people of this community is extended to the sorrowing ones in this hour of their bereavement.

Ellen Terrill was born in the state of Ohio on March 3rd, 1835, thus lacking but six days of being sixty five years old. Early in her life her parents moved to Iowa, being among the earliest settlers in that state. She was married to Alvin H. Griswold in 1858 unto which union was born one son, Dwight H. whose home is in this city. She was left a widow in 1862, her husband, who was a lieutenant in the Co. K, 3rd Iowa Cavalry, being killed in a skirmish in Arkansas. Until last August her home for the past thirty years has been at Avoca, Iowa. She was a member of the Congregational church at the latter place.
