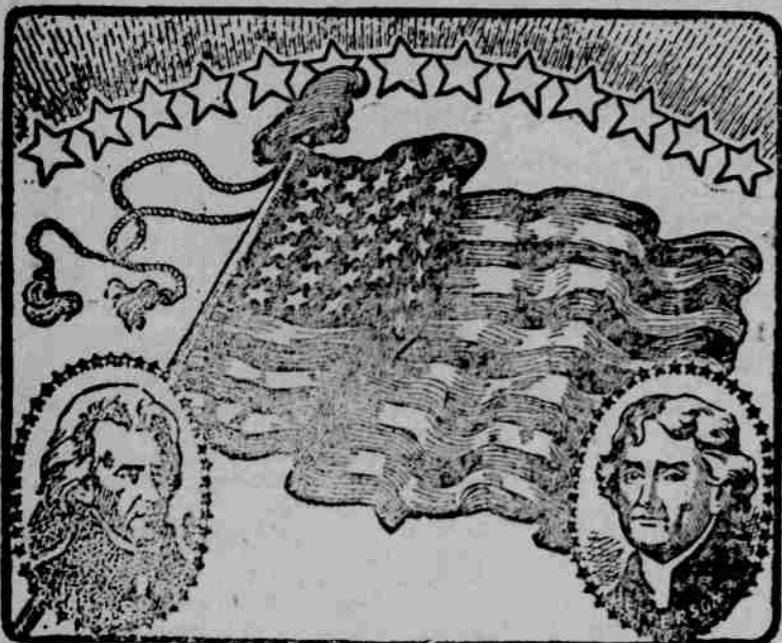

The following preamble and resolutions were, on motion adopted:

WHEREAS, The Assessed valuation of Sioux county, Nebraska, for the year 1899 is only \$4,550.35, as corrected by Board of Equalization subject, however, to corrections by the Clerk in so far as clerical errors may appear;

WHEREAS, 15 mills levy on said sum will make \$6,825.45, and the Board of County Commissioners are only allowed to issue Warrants to the amount of 85 per cent of said sum of Warrants for \$5,697.63; therefore be it resolved that the following items included in the estimate of Expenses for the year 1899, viz: District Court Expenses, salaries, Stationary, Printing and publishing incidental expenses, Institute and Officers fees be reduced to come within the limit of 9 mills on the dollar of the total assessed valuation of Sioux county for the year 1899 and that the items of County Board purposes included in the estimate of Expenses for 1899 be stricken out.

To procure County Revenue for the year 1899, the Board hereby make the following levy on a valuation of \$415,510.35, for General Fund 9 mills on dollar valuation.

For Bridge and Trenches mills on dollar valuation.

For Soldiers Relief 3 tenths mills on dollar valuation.

On motion the Clerk be and he hereby is ordered to levy on the valuation of Bowen Bond Precinct the required number of mills on the dollar to raise the amount of \$70.40, for interest on Court House Bonds and \$95.00, for Sinking fund for Court House Bonds and commission for collecting the same.

It appearing to the Board that a special Tax is necessary in order to provide for the payment of out standing Road District Warrants and to liquidate indebtedness against the following Road Districts, the Board hereby make the following levies:

Road District No. 1, 2 mills; Road District No. 2, 2 mills; Road District No. 3, 3 mills; Road District No. 4, 2 mills; Road District No. 5, 3 mills; Road District No. 7, 2 mills; Road District No. 8, 2 mills; Road District No. 9, 2 mills; Road District No. 10, 2 mills; Road District No. 11, 2 mills; Road District No. 12, 4 tenths mills; Road District No. 13, 2 mills; Road District No. 14, 2 mills; Road District No. 15, 2 mills, on the assessed valuation of all the taxable property within said Districts.

On motion the Clerk be and he hereby is ordered to levy on the valuation of the different School Districts, the amount legally filed and certified to by the proper officers to be so levied, also, the required number of mills respectively to raise the amount of interest and sinking fund on School District Bonds and commission for collecting same.
