

## Commissioner's Proceedings.

(continued from)

Harrison, Neb., July 6, 1904.

The board adjourned to meet at 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 10, to receive the report of the auditor.

Report continued to ascertain the total assessed property assessed in the county and its dollar value thereof.

The following preamble and resolution was adopted.

Whereas the assessed valuation of

the county for the year 1903 is only

\$25,421.55 as assessed by the clerk so

assessed areas may appear and

therefore \$2 million or less sum will

not be \$25,421.55. Therefore, be it resolved

that the following included in the esti-

mate of expenses for the year 1904, will

offset court expenses, salaries, station-

ary printing and publishing, incidental

expenses, institutional office fees, be re-

solved to come within \$1 million the differ-

ence of the total assessed valuation of

the county for the year 1903 to the

estimated expense for the year 1904.

Board hereby make the following

allowance on a valuation of \$25,421.55, for

generalized 9 miles on the dollar valuation

for bridges 4 miles on the dollar valuation

Road District No. 1, no levy

" " 2 " 1 mill

" " 3 " no levy

" " 8 " 4 mills

" " 9 " 2 "

" " 11 " 4 "

" " 12 " 3.10 "

" " 13 " 6.10 "

The board found the average assess-

ment of horses to be in the county \$4.22

and in the various precincts as follows:

Antelope, \$5.99; Andrews, 7.18; Bow-

en, 5.65; Cottonwood, 5.88; Hat creek,

5.29; Montrose, 6.07; Sugarloaf, 6.11;

Snake creek, 5.47; Sheep creek, 5.78; Run-

ningwater, 6.41; White River, 6.24; Whis-

tle creek, 19.27; Warbonnet, 5.53; Vil-

lage of Harrison, 9.08.

It was found that in order to equalize

the assessment on horses the following

per cent; Cottonwood, raised 14 per cent;

Hat creek, raised 16 per cent; Montrose,

changed; Sugarloaf, raised 31 per cent;

Snake creek, raised 15 per cent; Sheep

creek, raised 51 per cent; Runningwa-

ter, lowered 51 per cent; White river, no

change; Whistle creek, lowered 7 per

cent; Warbonnet, raised 11 per cent;

Village of Harrison, no change.

The board found the average assessed

value of cattle in the county to be \$3.81

and in the various precincts to be as

follows:

Antelope, \$1.51; Andrews, 3.94; Bowen,

3.75; Cottonwood, 3.45; Hat creek, 3.27;

Montrose, 3.50; Sugarloaf, 3.35; Snake

creek, 4.86; Sheep creek, 4.88; Running-

water, 4.06; White river, 3.81; Whistle

creek, 4.12; Warbonnet, 3.48; Village of

Harrison, 3.71.

It was found to equalize the assess-

ment on cattle in the county, the follow-

cent; Snake creek, raised 61 per cent; Sheep

creek, lowered 21 per cent; Runningwa-

ter, lowered 51 per cent; White river, no

change; Whistle creek, lowered 7 per

cent; Warbonnet, raised 11 per cent;

Village of Harrison, raised 11 per cent.
