COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS.

Harrison, Nebr., Nov. 17, 1894
Board of county commissioners met in special session as per call. Present Bigelow, Jordan, Cutters and Pontius, clerk.

P. F. Cranblet presented petition for permission to put in a box culvert near his premises on road No. 6 at SE 4 of Sec. 22 Twp. 31 R. 3d, where ditch was flooded by road overrider, and it appearing that the filling of said ditch damaged Mr. Cranblet's watering place by reason of no ditch; it is resolved by board of commissioners that said Cranblet is authorized to purchase plank and spikes sufficient to make, and put in a box culvert to carry away surplus water, and file a certified copy with county clerk making claim for the expense.

The road petition of James Stoneking and others was withdrawn at request of said Stoneking and clerk instructed to return to him his note for grantees of expenses and file petition in office of Clerk as withdrawn.

The road petition of Ed. Schmidt was taken up and final action deferred until next meeting and the Cottonwood road ordered resurveyed.

A new petition of James Stoneking and others for the establishment of a county road was taken up and clerk instructed to appoint a commissioner to view road and report his decision.

Petition of Hattie O'Connor and others for establishment of a public road and vacation of a portion of a public road was taken up and clerk instructed to appoint commissioner to view same. On motion the present lines between Bowes precinct and Warbowiec precinct were changed as follows to wit:

Sections 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18 Twp. 32 Range 57 and Section 13 Twp. 32 Range 56 and hereby detached from Warbowiec precinct and attached to and made a part of Bowes precinct and the boundaries of road district No. 3 and road district No. 32 are changed to conform to the boundaries of the above precincts, to effect on and after this date November 17th, 1894.
