COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Harrison, Nebr., Nov 17 1904  
Board of county commissioners met in special session as per call. Present: Biegelow, Jordan, Cutlers and Pontius clerk.

P. F. Crumble presented petition for permission to put in a box culvert, near his premises on road No. 3 at SE 4 of Sec. 23 Twp. 31 R. 03, where ditch was filled by road overseer, and it appearing that the filling of said ditch damaged Mr. Crumble's watering place by reason of no ditch; it is resolved by board of commissioners that said Crumble be authorized to purchase plank and spikes sufficient to make, and put in a box culvert to carry away surplus water, and file a certified bill with county clerk making claim for the expense.

The road petition of James Stinking and others was withdrawn at request of said Stinking and clerk instructed to return to him his note for grantee of expenses and file petition in office of Co. clerk as withdrawn.

The road petition of Ed Schmidt was taken up and final action deferred to next meeting and the Cottonwood road ordered surveyed.

A new petition of James Stinking and others for the establishment of a county road was taken up and clerk instructed to appoint a commissioner to view road and report his decision.

Petition of Hattie O' Connor and others for establishment of a public road and vacation of a portion of a public road was taken up and clerk instructed to appoint commissioner to view same.

On motion the precinct lines between Bowes precinct and Warbancet precinct were changed as follows to wit:
