

AERIAL RAILWAY IN INDIA

Sensa lonal Religious Ceremony that Occurs in the Himplayes.

One of the most remarkable and sensational religious ceremonies in the whole of India takes place annually at Kain, in the Himalayas.

From a chiff overhanging a precinitous gorge several hundred feet deep rope is stretched, and justened to a strong stake on the opposite side of the ravine. The rope is of great length, nearly 2.500 feet, and when it is stretched that the upper end will be several hundred feet higher than the lower end.

Hown this terrible incline the victim or performer slides, the precaution having been taken to wet the rope to prevent it from eatching fire from the friction:

This descent is effected as follows: The performer sits astride on a kind of rough wooden saddle fitted with loles through which the rope is threaded, while to his legs are atthened bags filled with sand to enable him to maintain an upright position during his descent and also to increase the momentum. The lower end of the rope is wound round with rugs and carpets to prevent the jheri, as the performer is called, from dashing his brains out against the pole to which the rope is fastened.

The first few hundred yards of the descent is accomplished with lightning velocity, as is indicated by the stream of smoke which follows his wake. The incline then diminishing, the pace becomes slower and slower, so that by the time he reaches the goal he is able to stop himself without dan-

The underlying motive of this curious ceremony is that if the flight is safely accomplished prosperity is assured to the crops for that year. This sentiment naturally minimizes the danger of the feat, as it is to everybody's interest that it should be safely accomplished. Indeed, a similar motive is at the bottom of certain religlous festivals in Roman Catholic countries.

************** UMBRELLA-BEARERS.

Pakoe Bowono X., the "Nail of the Universe," as he styles himself, dwells in Surakarta, on the island of Java, His "bardwareship" is the greatest of the native potentates on that unruly island, and is allowed by his Dutch conquerors to spend his enormous for tune in maintaining a court without That is about all he can do, says a writer in the Century Magazine, for the wilv Dutch also maintain a rival emperor to play against him, and refuse to allow Pakoe to leave his palace bounds without the consent of the resident governor.

Since state ceremontes are almost the only ontiet for his energies, he has elaborated them to a point where they are bewildering to the novice. In nothing is this better illustrated than in the umbrella "ritual."

Surakarta is the paradise of umbreiles. They are carried proudly over the head of every official and nobleman, but must be shut at the approach of a person of higher rank. Inside the "kraton" or royal enclosure a park of about a square mile round the palnee buildings-no umbrella may be carried open except that of the emperor bimself. The umbrella is the crown, the wand of office, the outward sign of rank and distinction.

There are unitrellas of gold outside and inside for the emperor; of gold outside only for the empress; with . stripe of yellow satin for the emperor's brothers; with a wider stripe of the same material for . his balk ev on gregated in the shall a 10, which includes \$5,000 for scuffold- brothers; of white slik with a narrow wife pear the space and serve each. There is an official guide book to the umbrella labyrinth of Surakarta which contains not less than three hundred various designs, in all imaginable cotos and ornamentation. Every rank is entitled to a differently designed state In order to give due importance to all things belonging to officers of high rank, such as letters or betel-boxes enspidors (carried by attendants where ever their masters go), these articles are shaded by special umbrellas whee their owner does not precede them.

The "Nail of the Universe" is ex tremely afraid of poisoning, and so has his meals prepared at the Dutch real dency. Every noon his food is borne through the streets to the palace, while an attendant holds over it a gold and yellow umbrella.
