Will Drill for Oil here Again

Wednesday afternoon a meeting was held by those interested in the drilling of another oil well here at the Commercial Club rooms. A large number from here and several from out of town were present, Dr. O. H. Hahn, of Hastings, presiding. Another company will be organized and they expect to commence drilling by June 1st. They will secure a geologist to make a survey of the land surrounding this city and also make the location for the well. The books were opened and considerable stock was subscribed. The pulling of the casing at the Big Chief Oil well shows that there is oil and gas here and we hope this company will bring in a producing well.

FARM BUREAU NOTES

(By County Extension Agent, H. R. Fausch.)

Federal Farm Loans

Stockholders of the Webster County Federal Farm Loan Association held their Annual meeting Friday, January 12th, with a dinner at the Royal hotel. This was followed by the Annual Business meeting.

John Zimmerman of Guide Rock was elected president, Chas. Cowley of Bladen, vice-president and Henry R. Fausch, Red Cloud, secretary-treasurer. Vet Widdersheim, Bladen, Joe Gurney, Inavale, Carl Fausch, Guide Rock were elected directors.

Report for Past year

Nineteen applications were received asking for \$131,900.00. Twelve loans were closed for \$56,400.00. This made a total of 34 Federal Farm loans in Webster county for \$202,400.00.

Dividend checks at the rate of 10% were passed out to stockholders. This is the ninth dividend. A letter from the Federal Land Bank was received stating that an extra dividend of 3% per annum has been declared. This extra dividend will be figured by the month and paid each share of stock for the full length of time that the stock has been held during the past 5 years.

The interest rates on Federal Farm Loans has dropped to 5 1/2% and will probably drop again before long according to reports.
