The organization expects to play two games a week here, one during the week days and one on Sunday. The officers expect to produce a winning team for Red Cloud this season.

BOARD OF EDUCATION TRANSACTS MUCH BUSINESS

Red Cloud, Nebraska
May 11, 1923.

The Board of Education met in special session at the call of the President at 8 o'clock p. m., at the Commercial Club rooms. All members present.

Mr. Meginnis the architect was present and submitted a new plan for addition to new High School building. Mr. Meginnis estimated that the cost of this plan would be \$50,000 at present prices of building materials. Motion made by Overing and seconded by Sherwood that the Board accept these plans. Motion carried.

Motion made by Perry and seconded by Crabill that all plans for rebuilding be postponed until the prices of building materials are back to somewhere near normal. Motion carried.

Motion made by Overing and seconded by Perry that we install the Smith-Hughes course of teaching Agriculture and do away with the Manual Training course. Motion carried.

The Board decided to carry more insurance on both school houses and instructed the Secretary to place the following amounts with the various insurance agents.

Died—Michael Donovan

Michael Donovan, one of the pioneers of this part of the state, passed away early Wednesday morning after an illness of several months duration at home of Mrs. McChitosh where he had been staying the past few years.

The deceased was born in Ireland and came to the United States in 1857 or '58. He came to Webster county in 1878 and helped build the C. B. G. track thru here and at Riverton. He was section foreman here for many years but retired several years ago and has always made his home in the city. He was a member of the Catholic church. Funeral services were conducted by Father Fitzgerald at the Amack mortuary this afternoon after which interment was made in the Catholic cemetery.
