

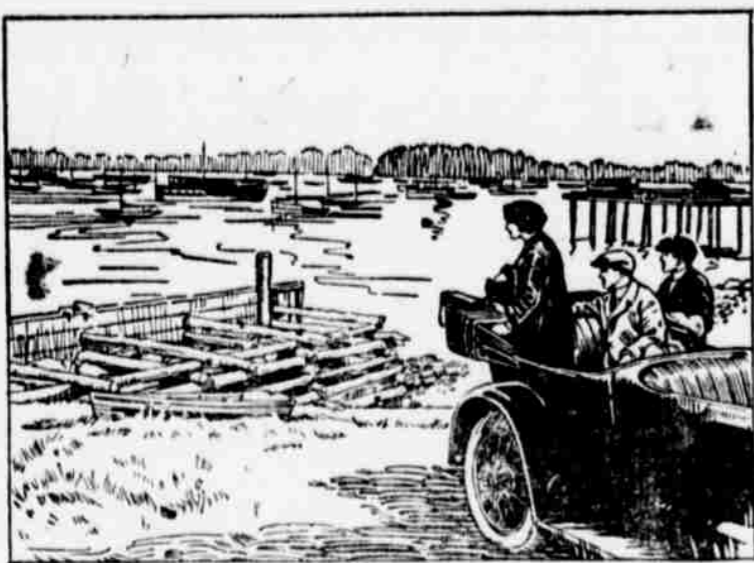

Obituary Mrs. Ruth Bowen

Ruth McIntyre was born at Burchard, Nebraska, on August 11, 1889, and died at a hospital in Hastings, September 16, 1923, where she underwent an operation for obstruction of the bowels; aged 34 years, 1 month and 5 days.
Early in life, she came with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. McIntyre, to Red Cloud, where her life has been practically spent. Here she was united in marriage with Richard Downen, January 29, 1907.
In 1911 she joined the Red Cloud Methodist Episcopal Church continuing a member until her death. She leaves to mourn her departure her husband; parents; two sisters, Miss Belle and Mrs. George Wittwer, and one brother, Lloyd.
The funeral services were conducted from the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. McIntyre, on Tuesday afternoon, Sept. 18, 1923, by Rev. C. G. Nelson. Interment was made in the Red Cloud Cemetery.
