The Red Cloud inexperienced foot ball team surprised all its supporters by defeating the heavy Guide Rock team, 20 to 0, Friday, October 12th.

Early in the first half was the only time that the Guide Rock team threatened to score. Red Cloud made its first touch down in the first quarter. They held Guide Rock for downs on the 40 yard line and after a series of line plunges and end runs Hedge carried it over on a line smash.

During the second quarter Hedge threw a pass for 20 yards to Edson who carried the remaining 20 for the second touch-down. The last touch-down came in the fourth quarter. Newhouse intercepted a forward pass on the 40 yard line. A series of end runs by Murnahan carried it to the 15 yard line and from there Pope with splendid interference carried it over, on a long end run.
