STATUS OF APPAM NOT DETERMINED

Whether Vessel is Prize or Auxiliary Cruiser to Be Settled.

PRISONERS WILL BE FREED WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Until it is decided whether the German commander aboard the British steamer Appam brought the ship to an American port as a prize of war or as a converted auxiliary cruiser of the German navy, there will be no determination of the American government's course respecting the ship.

Question of Crew. The United States, then finally will have to deal with the German crew under Lieutenant Berge, and if they are accounted in the naval service of Germany as were the crews of the Prinz Eitel Frederick and the Kron Prinz Wilhelm, already interned at the Norfolk navy yard, they too will be interned unless their ship goes to sea to run the oordon of British cruisers outside.
