VERDICT TRIFLE

High Tribunal Says Cheyenne Judgment for \$25,000 Must Be Shaved Down.

LOGGE PASSES ON MEMBERS

LINCOLN, Feb. 18.—(Special.)—The verdict rendered in the district court of Cheyenne county against the Union Pacific Railway company in the amount of \$25,000, in favor of the estate of Charles Logge, who, while a brakeman in the employ of the company, was killed while in the caboose of his train when it was struck by the engine of another train, is held to be excessive, and the high court orders \$1,000 cut off the judgment.

Logge Its Own Arbitrator.
Mark J. Wilber has no recourse in the courts because of his expulsion from Lincoln series of Eagles for alleged misappropriation of funds.

Owens Verdict Stands.
The court approves the judgment secured by the widow of John S. Owens, who was killed by an Omaha street car.
