

### SIX STEEL CONCERNS INDICTED IN OHIO

Youngstown Corporations Charged with Conspiracy to Fix Wages of Common Labor.

### OUTGROWTH OF STRIKE RIOTS

YOUNGSTOWN, O., March 8.—Indictments were returned today by the Mahoning county grand jury against the United States Steel company, four other steel companies, and Judge E. H. Gary, executive chairman of the United States Steel company. The defendants are charged with having formed a trust to fix the wages of common labor in violation of the laws of Ohio.

In addition to the United States company, the following concerns were indicted.

The Youngstown Sheet and Tube company, the Republic Iron and Steel company, the Brier Hill Steel company, the Youngstown Iron and Steel company, and the Carnegie Steel company.

The indictments followed a sweeping probe of the East Youngstown riots and labor troubles in January.

### GARY CALLS IT OUTRAGE

NEW YORK, March 8.—When informed of the indictment returned at Youngstown against the United States Steel corporation, other steel companies and himself, Judge Elbert H. Gary today issued the following statement: "There are no facts to justify the indictments returned by the Mahoning county grand jury against the United States Steel corporation or the Carnegie Steel company or any of the officers; or so far as I now against any of the other companies. The indictment is an outrage—a travesty."

### Giant Aeroplane Will Carry Crew of Thirty-Four Men

BUFFALO, N. Y., March 8.—A local manufacturer of engines for aeroplanes today received from a North Tonawanda boat manufacturing company the body of what is said to be the largest hydro-aeroplane that has been built in America. When completed it will carry thirty-four men. After being equipped with motor and propellers, it is said, it will be shipped to Great Britain.

When fully equipped and ready for service, this flying boat will weigh 51,000 pounds. The body is fifty-five feet long and is completely enclosed. In it will be four motors of 240 horsepower for flying purposes and one 200 horsepower motor for propelling the machine on the water. When the three sets of planes are constructed, the machine will be 120 feet from tip to tip. It has two gasoline tanks, which have a total capacity of about 1,000 gallons. Apartments are constructed in the body for food and ammunition. The hull is of cypress.

### Tonnage on the Lakes Greatest in History of Shipping

CLEVELAND, O., March 8.—The demand for men on the great lakes is tremendous, according to a statement issued here today by lake shipping interests. More tonnage has been lined up than ever before, and it is now estimated that 53,000,000 tons of ore will be moved, the statement says. Added to this will be 20,000,000 tons of coal and about 14,000,000 tons of grain. This volume of freight is so large that owners of vessels, it is announced, are contemplating breaking a channel through the ice so as to reach Sarnia on Lake Michigan, March 20, so as to put their ships into commission. The wage schedule on the lakes, the statement asserts, is practically double that on the Atlantic seaboard.

### German Fleet is Sighted Monday in the North Sea

LONDON, March 8.—A German fleet, consisting of at least fifty big warships, followed by a large gray-painted armed trawler fleet, two big Zeppelins and numerous submarines, was sighted Monday afternoon in the North Sea off Ferrol-shire island, north of Holland, according to the report of a trawler which has arrived at Ymuiden, says Reuter's Amsterdam correspondent.

The fleet was proceeding westward. The correspondent adds that Monday morning five large cruisers of unknown nationality passed Ymuiden at full speed.

Henry Dahmke, aged 59 years, a resident of Omaha for the last thirty-two years, died Tuesday evening at a local hospital. He is survived by three brothers, John, Charles and William.

#### Martha Fischer.

Martha Fischer, aged 41 years, wife of Henry Fischer of Pierce, died Wednesday morning at a local hospital. The body will be taken to Pierce Thursday morning for interment.

#### Edwin H. Farrar.

Edwin H. Farrar, aged 60 years, 616 Capitol avenue, a resident of Omaha for the last twenty-four years, died Tuesday night at the Nicholas Senn hospital after an illness of several years. He is survived by his wife and one brother. Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock from Dodder's chapel, with interment in West Lawn cemetery.

### Hearings in Brandeis Inquiry Terminate

WASHINGTON, March 8.—Public hearings on the nomination of Louis D. Brandeis of Boston to be associate justice of the supreme court, were terminated today by the judiciary sub-committee of the senate. The inquiry has been in progress for a month. The sub-committee gave no indication as to when it would report to the judiciary committee.

### SEARCH FOR ARMS AT VALENTINE TRIAL

Feeling is Intense Against Man Charged with Double Murder.

### COURT ROOM IS CROWDED

VALENTINE, Neb., March 8.—The trial of William W. Cryderman, charged with the murder of Mrs. Anna Layport and Mrs. Nellie Heelan, opened this afternoon in the district court here before a crowd which taxed the capacity of the court house. Evidence at the preliminary hearing of Cryderman, held several months ago, went to show that while working as a farm hand on the ranch of John Heelan and while the owner was in Omaha, Cryderman, in a fit of anger for a reprimand from Mrs. Heelan, shot that woman to death. Her companion, Mrs. Layport, who had witnessed the killing, attempted to summon help by telephone and was twice shot while talking to neighbors. The bodies of both women, Mrs. Layport being probably fatally wounded, but still alive, were saturated with oil and the house set on fire.

Their bodies were later found in the burned dwelling. Taking one of his employer's horses, Cryderman, the evidence shows, rode to a railroad station and boarded a freight train. He was captured by Sheriff Roseler and kept in hiding for several days, as threats had been made to lynch him.

The feeling against the prisoner is still intense, as was shown today at the trial, and no one is permitted to enter the court room without submitting to a search for concealed weapons. John Heelan, husband of one of the murdered women, deposed Cryderman during the trial today and was with difficulty quieted.

### Roosevelt Denies That He Wants the Illinois Delegation

NEW YORK, March 8.—John W. McGrath, secretary to Theodore Roosevelt, announced today that he had sent the following telegram from Mr. Roosevelt to Louis G. Stevenson, secretary of state of Illinois, at Springfield: "I have today received the following cable for transmission to you: 'I hereby disavow candidacy of any and all delegates to Illinois primary who file petitions expressing preference for me for presidential nomination.' "THEODORE ROOSEVELT."

### Villa With Small Army Within Few Miles of Border

COLUMBUS, N. M., March 8.—With three American cattle men, presumably held as prisoners, Francesco Villa was reported today with between 200 and 300 men at a point on the Boca Grande river in Chihuahua, fifteen miles west of Columbus and twenty-seven miles south of the border.

### GERMANY LAYS A LINE OF MINES AROUND ENGLAND

LONDON, March 8.—The blockade of England by mines, reported as threatened by Germany, is already in existence along the trade route to Holland, according to naval circles here. German submarines are reported to have been busy recently laying anchored mines between the mouth of the Thames and the Galloway lightship. It is in this neighborhood that many disasters have occurred during the last month.

### FRENCH RECAPTURE CHAMPAGNE POSTS

Portion of Trenches Lost During Monday's Fighting Retaken and Counter Attack Repulsed.

### FIGHT FOR VERDUN CONTINUES

PARIS, March 8.—(Via London.)—In the Champagne the French have recaptured portions of the trenches lost on March 6, according to semi-official announcement made here today.

The situation north of Verdun is unchanged. No infantry attacks were made last night, the announcement says. Artillery fighting continues.

The text of the communication issued by the French war office this afternoon follows:

"In the Champagne district east of Meuse we launched an attack which placed us again in possession of the sections of trenches occupied by the enemy March 6. We took eighty-five prisoners, including three officers, and captured a machine gun. A counter attack delivered a little later against the positions we held was successfully repulsed.

"In the Argonne our artillery has shelled the highways in the vicinity of Mount Faucon, over which it was reported automobile transports were making their way.

"North of Verdun no change has been reported. During the night the Germans continued their bombardment of our front west of the Meuse, but without putting forward their infantry.

"Our batteries responded with energy in this sector, as well as east of the Meuse, where the artillery bombardment has been intermittent.

"There has been spirited artillery fighting in the Woivre. We have bombarded Blanche Grimoucourt and the environs of Fresnes.

"An attack against the railroad and the highway at Manheulles was checked by our curtain of fire and the activity of the French infantry."

Large French Position Captured. BERLIN, March 8.—(Via London.)—The capture of a French position west of the Meuse on both sides of the Forges brook and three kilometers deep was announced today by German army headquarters.

It was also announced that the villages of Forges and Ragneville, the heights of Raben and the Cumeres Woods were in German possession. The capture of fifty-eight officers, 3,277 men and ten cannon is officially reported. In the Woivre district the French were driven out of the last houses they held in the village of Fresnes. More than 700 prisoners were made.

### Dieguez to Lead Carranza Troops

DOUGLAS, Ariz., March 8.—General M. M. Dieguez, who was withdrawn several months ago from command of the campaign against the Yaqui Indians in Sonora, has been returned from his assignment in the state of Jalisco and again will lead the Carranza troops in the Yaqui

river valley, according to reports received here today from Hermosillo, capital of Sonora.

General Francisco R. Serrano, who has been in command of the Mexican troops operating against the Yaqui Indians, has been ordered to Celaya, Mexico, to join an expeditionary force being gathered to operate against Zapata bands. General Alvaro Obregon, it was said, is organizing an army of 2,000 for the Zapata campaign.
