Text of German Memorandum Reviewing Controversy Over Use of Subsea Boats

WASHINGTON, March 8.—The text of the memorandum presented by Count von Bernstorff follows:

"The imperial German government, on account of the friendly relations which have always existed between the two nations, and earnestly desiring to continue them, wishes to explain the U-boat question once more to the American government.

"At the outbreak of the war the German government, acting upon the suggestion of the United States, immediately expressed its readiness to ratify the Declaration of London at the time a German prize code had already been issued, which was entirely, and without modification based upon the rules of the Declaration of London.

Neutral Commerce Destroyed. "Great Britain, on the other hand, declined to ratify the Declaration of London, and after the outbreak of the war began to restrict the legitimate trade of neutrals in order to hit Germany.

"The use of the submarine naturally necessitated a restriction of the free movement of neutrals and constituted a danger for them which warranted a ward off by a special warning announcement.

"The order to use arms on British merchantmen was supplemented by instructions to masters of such ships to hoist such flags and to ram U-boats.

"(C). The interception of mails in violation of international law (compare American memorandum to England of January 19, 1916), is meant to stop any intercourse of Germany with foreign countries.

"(D). England, by systematically and increasingly oppressing neutral countries, following the principle of 'might before right' has prevented neutral trade on land with Germany, so as to complete the blockade of the central powers intended to starve their civil population.
