OBJECTS TO BORDEN'S RECRUITING PLAN

Lord Shaughnessey Says Scheme to Raise Canadian Army to Half Million Wasteful.

THOUSANDS ARE STILL IN CAMP

MONTREAL, Quebec, March 10. -Lord Shaughnessy, president of the Canadian Railway company, is opposed to the plan of Sir Robert Borden, the Canadian premier, to raise the Canadian contingent in the Europea war to 500,000 men.

Addressing a meeting of business and military leaders held here yesterday to encourage recruiting, Lord Shaughnessy sald he did not regard the plan as practicab'e and that if Canada was to attempt to raise 225,000 men in addition to its present army it would cause a serious draft upon the working population. He announced that the agricultural department has asked the Canadian Pacific for aid in taking 10,000 farmers to the western provinces for seeding and harvesting work.

Lord Shaughnessy advised that Canada ge slow about recruiting, saying that some of the first Canadian contingent are attil in camp in England, while 130,000 men, representing an outlay of probably \$12,000,000 a month, are still in Canada, with no prospect of being moved to Europe for a long time. He said it would have been better to have gone more slowly and saved \$5,000,000 a month, for use hereafter. He asked if it would be wise to go on lessening Canada's ability to give financial aid to the British empire when the time of its need should

Major General Sir Sam Hughes said that no injury would be threatened by shortage of labor if 1,000,000 men went to the front, adding that Montreal could recruit 50,000 to 70,000. Lord Saughnessy replied if so the women would have to

The meeting adopted a resolution approving the efforts to recruit men in Montreal and calling upon employers to

A resolution offered by Leo Doyon, a French-Canadian, that no action be taken to accelerate Canada's share in the war, was lost in a storm of hisses.
