

# OBJECTS TO BORDEN'S RECRUITING PLAN

Lord Shaughnessy Says Scheme to Raise Canadian Army to Half Million Wasteful.

## THOUSANDS ARE STILL IN CAMP

MONTREAL, Quebec, March 10.—Lord Shaughnessy, president of the Canadian Railway company, is opposed to the plan of Sir Robert Borden, the Canadian premier, to raise the Canadian contingent in the European war to 500,000 men.

Addressing a meeting of business and military leaders held here yesterday to encourage recruiting, Lord Shaughnessy said he did not regard the plan as practicable and that if Canada was to attempt to raise 225,000 men in addition to its present army it would cause a serious draft upon the working population. He announced that the agricultural department has asked the Canadian Pacific for aid in taking 10,000 farmers to the western provinces for seeding and harvesting work.

Lord Shaughnessy advised that Canada is slow about recruiting, saying that some of the first Canadian contingent are still in camp in England, while 120,000 men, representing an outlay of probably \$12,000,000 a month, are still in Canada, with no prospect of being moved to Europe for a long time. He said it would have been better to have gone more slowly and saved \$5,000,000 a month, for use hereafter. He asked if it would be wise to go on increasing Canada's ability to give financial aid to the British empire when the time of its need should come.

Major-General Sir Sam Hughes said that no injury would be threatened by shortage of labor if 1,000,000 men went to the front, adding that Montreal could recruit 50,000 to 70,000. Lord Shaughnessy replied if so the women would have to enlist.

The meeting adopted a resolution approving the efforts to recruit men in Montreal and calling upon employers to encourage their employees to enlist.

## Family Broken Up by Juvenile Court is Reunited Again

Because of the charitable activities of the William McKinley lodge of 19th St. and the Omaha family broken up at the order of juvenile court, has been reunited and placed upon the high road to happiness.

Juvenile court investigators some months ago found a family with several small children living in such squalid circumstances that the children were immediately taken away and placed in the Detention home.

The parents, through ignorance and lack of inspiration, accepted their misfortune stolidly.

A committee of the lodge members heard of the case and investigated. Within a short time the father had a good job and was installed in another and cleaner home and a course of hygienic and economic instruction administered.

Friday juvenile authorities permitted the children to be taken back home for the first time.

## Waters of Platte Sweep Over Tracks of Union Pacific

There was enough solid ice left in the Platte river so that a gorge formed Thursday night near the village of Meno, a station on the Union Pacific between Valley and Fremont. While the gorge held only a couple of hours, the river raised sufficiently so that the water was thrown out over the east bank of the stream, flooding a large area of the low land in the western portion of Douglas county.

As soon as the gorge in the vicinity of Meno formed a dynamiting crew was sent out from Omaha on a special train and in a short time had the ice broken up. However, not until the water had swept out over the tracks and over several farms to the east. As a result of the high water trains Nos. 4 and 13 on the Union Pacific came in from Fremont over the Northwestern line. The water has now gone down sufficiently so that the Union Pacific is running over its own rails.

## Orders for Steel Breaks All Records

NEW YORK, March 10.—The monthly statement of the unfilled orders of the United States Steel corporation issued today broke all records. The orders stood on February 29 at \$508,906 tons, an increase of 64,130 tons over January 31, and compared with \$489,718 tons December 31, 1905, the previous high record.

## ADULT BIBLE CLASS AT NORTH CHURCH BANQUETS

The adult Bible class of the North Presbyterian church held its annual banquet Thursday night, with covers laid for seventy-five. The banquet was spread in the large dining room of the church, the tables being arranged to seat ten each. The serving was done by the women of the class.

Following the banquet, the Bible class gathered in the women's parlors, where a musical and literary program was carried out. There were short addresses, all dealing with adult Sunday school work and the best methods to adopt in increasing attendance.

One of the features of the affair was an address by Mrs. A. Hoyle, the first teacher of the old Knox Presbyterian church, twenty-eight years ago. At the time she had a class of twelve men and women, several of whom are still members of the Bible class of the North church, a consolidation of the Knox and the Second Presbyterian churches.

## BRITISH WARSHIPS ARE SUNK BY MINES

Torpedo Boat Destroyer Coquette and Torpedo Boat Go Down Off the East Coast.

## FORTY-FIVE LIVES ARE LOST

LONDON, March 10.—The British torpedo boat destroyer Coquette and torpedo boat No. 11 have been sunk by striking mines. It was officially announced this afternoon.

The official announcement says the number of casualties in connection with the sinking of the warships was forty-five.

The statement follows: "The torpedo boat destroyer Coquette, Lieutenant Vere Seymour, R. N. R., in command and H. M. Torpedo boat No. 11, Lieutenant John A. T. Legh, R. N., have struck mines off the east coast and sunk. The casualties were: "Coquette—An officer and twenty-one men. "The torpedo boat—Three officers and twenty men."

**French Steamship is Sunk.** PARIS, March 10.—A Havas dispatch from Havre says the French line steamship Louisiana sank last night at 11 o'clock. All the crew were saved. No passengers were aboard. It is presumed that the vessel was sunk by the same submarine that has been operating along the coast between Boulogne and Havre and which torpedoed the Hermatrice.

EVANSTON, Wyo., March 10.—(Special Telegram.)—Glen Morrison, who recently killed Cal Hinkle in a pistol duel, in which he was desperately wounded, will be tried for manslaughter during the April term of district court. He was given a preliminary hearing on a charge of murder in the first degree, but the presiding justice did not consider that the evidence justified such a charge and held him merely for manslaughter. His bail has been fixed at \$1,000.

Morrison, who was not expected to live, now is recovering rapidly from his wound.
