### ALLIES MASS BIG ARMY AT SALONIKI

Indications that Great Offensive Movement Will Start Early in May.

#### TEUTONS MAY ATTACK FIRST

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) SALONIKI, March 1 .- The great Balkan offensive of the allied armies is believed to be arranged for the first week in May. Should weather conditions prove exceptionally favorable, it may occur even earlier. That it will take place soon no one in Saloniki doubts for a moment. The only thing that can stop it is for the Germans and the Bulgarians to move first-and there is little belief in this contingency.

The increasing stores of munitions and supplies arriving in this port in an unending stream, the constant hard work of General Sarrail and his staff, the activity of the allied scouts and aeroplanes and the cheery features and high spirits of the French and British soldiers, and the eagerness of the Serbs to get themselves into the fighting again at the earliest possible moment, add to the conviction that an attack on Saloniki in the spring is a certainty.

There are today some 85,000 French and 120,000 British troops here, which is about a man to every foot and a half of defensive line to be held. Besides the British and French, there are some 16,000 Serbs in Saloniki and along the Greek frontier. There are also said to be some 15,000 more French on their way from Marseilles, making a total of 236,000 allied troops as a garrison for Saloniki, not counting the personnel of the warship stationed in the harber.

Macedonia or Egypt. Military oritics consider this figure far

in excess of defensive necessity, particularly when the physical defense works of the place to be held by them are as planned as those which have been constructed around Saloniki. But in addition to these forces actually available, or soon to be available in Macedonia, there are the remainder of the French and British troops withdrawn from Gallipoli, still at Mudros and generally scattered about islands of Lemnos, Tenedos, Imbros and Mytilenc. There are probably more, but assuming that there are only 100,00 of these, ready to be dispatched to Macedonia or Egypt. as occasion may require, this would bring the figure of those available for instant use in Saloniki up to 336,000 men by spring. There are also 35,000 Serbs in America and elsewhere whom have only recently been called to the colors and some of whom are arriving every few days at Saloniki. which brings the figure up to 361,000 men.

Large Army for Albania. Meanwhile in Corfu there are sour 134,000 Serbs refitting, and at Bizerta some 25,000 more, making a total of 159,000 Serbs available for work in Albania, to be added to whatever force the Italians deide to concentrate at Aviona. Considering these figures, the general impres-sion here is that they indicate either a wasteful excess of force gathered in and about the Balkans or that a general Balkan offensive is planned.

In this event of such an offensive being occessfully begun it will be impossible for the king of the Hellenes or anyone felse to hold the Greek army back from going on to Sofia with the allied powers In this event, to the 520,000 men available for a Balkan offensive in the spring. may be, added 200,000 Greeks, making a total of 720,000 men operating in the Balkans by midsummer against a maximum of 600,000 Germans, Austrians, Bulgarians
