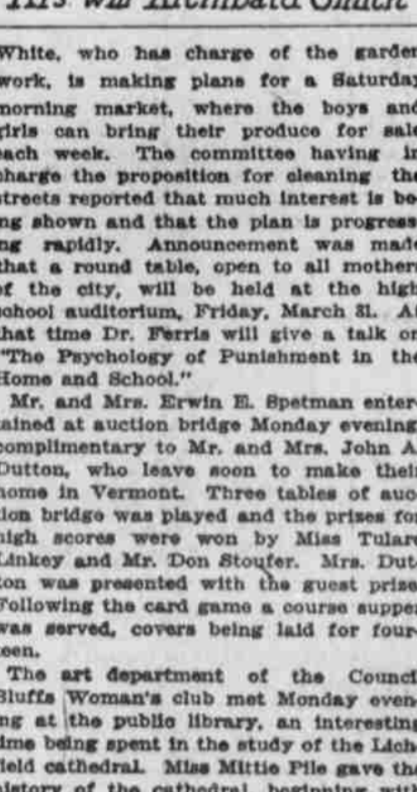

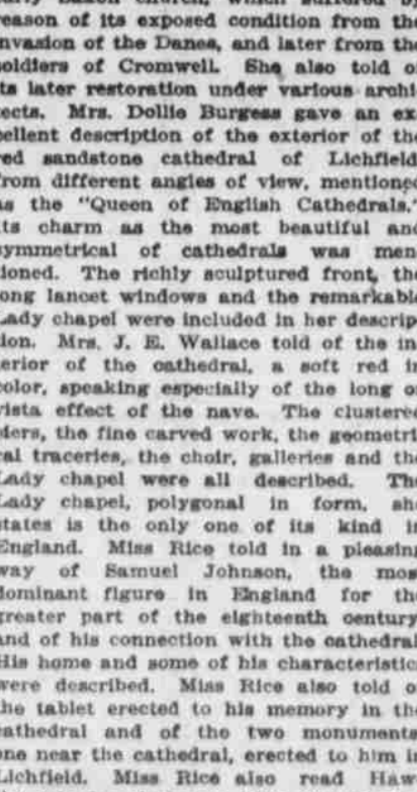

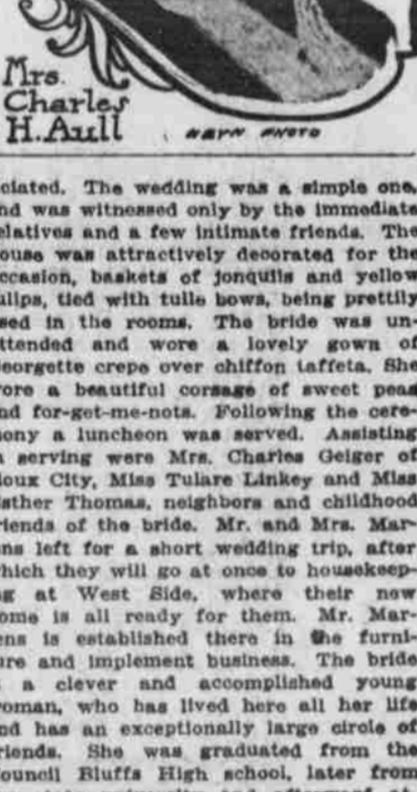
White, who has charge of the garden work, is making plans for a Saturday morning market, where the boys and girls can bring their produce for sale each week.



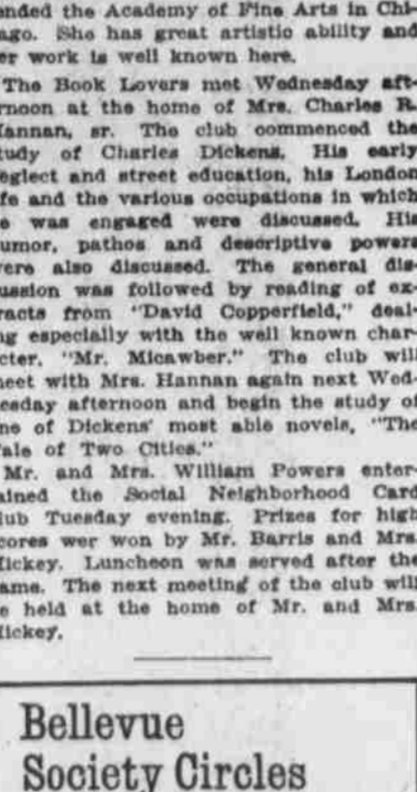

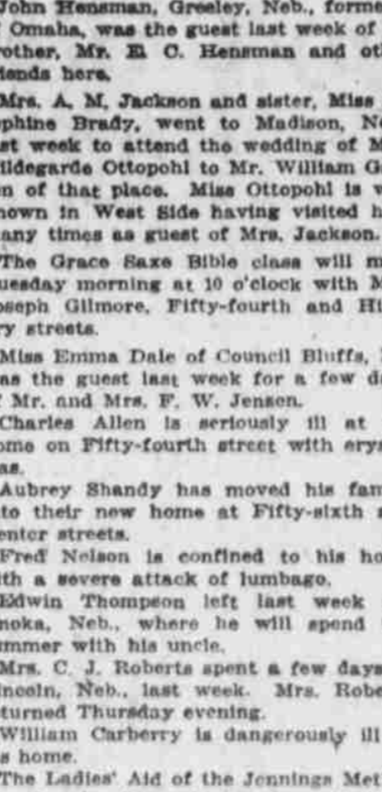
