HERE are two "simplicity dresses." "What Every Woman Knows" is the name that I have given to the tea dress of faded scarlet chiffon and silver lace shown in the upper left hand corner of this page. What could be more adorable than a beautiful woman wearing this particular dress, which is made of shaded scarlet chiffon, varying from palest rose to the color deep in the hearts of American Beauty roses, with bands of satin the same shades and trimmed with antique silver lace. With this dress is worn a cap of silver lace and chiffon, and this combination, with its complementary of rose-shaded lights

and perfect appointments, would make any woman a creature irresistible. The second dress, of which two views are given, is called "My Dream Girl," and it is as aptly named, I think, as the first one. It is made of white net trimmed with iridescent embroidery, showing all the light and colors of opals. The bodice is of pale opal green satin, and the pipings on the skirt and the little coat are of palest blue and green satin. On the corsage is worn a tiny bouquet of hand-made flowers representing the opal tints, and the coat, skirt as well as the tiny fascinating cap which fastens under the chin, are trimmed with bands of purest white swansdown.
