BOSSIE WILL TRY MUNICIPAL COURT

Milk Inspector to File Complaints Against Twenty-Five Dairymen for Too Thin Milk.

HAS MADE MANY RECENT TESTS

Dairy and Milk Inspector Bossie states he has information ready for complaints against twenty-five milk and cream dealers.

The prosecutor will file one complaint first in the municipal court as a test, and if that court has jurisdiction, then the other complaints will follow in the same court.

The legal minimum for butter-fat in milk is 2.2. Some of the samples tested as low as 2.6. The offending dealers include the large as well as the small concerns.
