

MANAGERS SAY THE TRAINMEN UNFAIR

Students of Labor Conditions Ask for Explanation as to Meaning of Terms.

QUESTION OF EIGHT-HOUR DAY

CHICAGO, March 26.—(Special.)—With only a few days remaining before the leaders of the railroad brotherhoods declare their wage demands to the railroad managers, much interest centers in this advance announcement from the office of the Association of Western Railroads located here.

In the formal demand drawn up by the unions and now ready to be presented to the railroads, appear these words:

Article I, Section A: In all road service 100 miles or less, eight hours or less shall constitute a day, except in passenger service.

Students of labor conditions from various parts of the country have written to the office of the Association of Western Railroads asking for an explanation of this unusual term, "or less" in a proposed eight-hour day.

It has always been our understanding that an eight-hour day contemplates eight hours of labor honestly and completely rendered in return for an eight-hour wage honestly and completely paid.

Alsace-Lorraine May Yet Become The Buffer State

(Correspondence of The Associated Press.) AMSTERDAM, Netherlands, March 27.—The conversion of Alsace-Lorraine into an independent buffer state between France and Germany, possibly joined to the small independent Grand Duchy of Luxembourg that is now in German occupation, is the latest suggestion put forward in Dutch socialist circles in an attempt to bridge the deep chasm between the French and German socialist groups and to enable the socialists on both belligerent sides to work with one accord in their respective countries for the attainment of peace.

The Alsace-Lorraine question is the great stumbling block which has hitherto defeated all attempts of the Socialist International to restore harmony and unity among the various national groups affiliated to it, and the Dutch socialist organ, Het Volk, now put forward the foregoing as the chief point in a draft of peace terms upon the basis of which, it urges, all socialists might undertake a campaign in favor of ending the present terrible struggle.

WORLD'S LABOR PEACE CONGRESS

(Continued from Page One.) Farmers are an integral part of organized society—part of the vitality of the nation. In appreciation of their dignity and value, it is the duty of the wage-earners to make demands upon the world assembled in the next world congress that nothing touching the lives of the workers shall be determined without taking counsel with them.

"Such a demand would set high standards of democracy and would give promise to the principle of human welfare that could not be ignored. The labor movement is the great humanizing, democratizing force, in the affairs of nations, and it must have a place wherever the welfare of the wage-earners is concerned.

"If demands are not made they can be ignored with good consequence. But when ideals of human welfare, the rights and interests of the common people are presented and urged in world tribunals, they cannot be wholly rejected. These demands will not be presented or considered unless the wage-earners send their representatives to the Labor congress in an obligation we owe to our ideals and to fellow-workers of the present and the future as well as a great opportunity.

"The plan approved by the American Federation of Labor contains the following general suggestions: The labor movement of any country, even though not affiliated, could send one delegate. If there is no national labor movement in a country, let the representatives of the organized labor of that country agree to send one delegate.

"The proposed plan for the labor congress is formulated for the purpose of securing the representative thought and conviction of the organized labor movement of the world. It is well known that the labor movements in every country are a power for democracy, and insistently and fearlessly urge in every relation the paramount importance of the human element. There are no other organizations that are concerned wholly and purely with human welfare—the pro-

MONTREY, Mexico, March 26.—A special train from Torreon, bringing women and children of the American colony there, passed through here last night. The women were seated on the floor of a box car, protected by a barrier of trunks. The guard on the train engaged in a running fight with a large number of bandits, who rode alongside the train for several miles from Preventil to Santo Niño. Wires were cut on both sides, and attempts made to burn the bridge.

MANY PLACES WORTH SEEING

Omaha is surrounded with Beauty Spots to Attract the Eye.

Art Galleries and Museum Collection Will Be Open to the Visitors—Stock Yards Will Also Keep Open House.

Omaha is well termed the convention city, both because it is the city where many conventions are held and because it is an ideal city in which to find a convention. For Omaha is a city that enjoys many places to go either for amusement, sightseeing or to learn, and the convention visitor finds much to interest him during his stay.

Parks in the summer, spring and fall are the best possible places to while away the hours in a pleasant manner. Omaha has a park in every direction from the downtown district and street car lines run direct to their entrances. In the summer the parks appear as one vast block of green. In the autumn and fall the parks are more beautiful than ever. The beautiful green foliage changes color until the park is green, yellow, red and brown. The tall trees protect the sloping greens and the lawns remain soft and firm until late in the winter when the frost eventually kills the last lingering bits of life.

Miles of Boulevards. Connecting with and running through the parks of Omaha are the boulevards. The boulevards are still more or less in an uncompleted state and Omaha can hardly boast of boulevards until the completion of the central boulevard around and through the city and around Carter lake, but that part of the Central boulevard that is completed and Florence boulevard are beautiful drives.

Minna Leas Station. For the convention visitor and especially the visitor from the smaller cities, the water works pumping station is a good place to visit. It is not often that a citizen takes the time or trouble to view the water works in his own town and as the Omaha station is a very large one, many take the advantage offered and examine the one in Florence.

Over Thirteen Hundred Men Join American Army in Last Ten Days

WASHINGTON, March 26.—A total of 1,338 recruits have been added to the army in the last ten days. The War department announced last night. The campaign to add some 2,000 men to the fighting forces, bringing them up to maximum strength, began March 15, ten days after American troops had been ordered into Mexico in pursuit of Villa. A total of 2,824 applicants were examined to obtain 700 men.

At Last England is Forced to Recognize Volunteer Training Corps as Part of Military System.

LONDON, March 27.—The decision of the government to recognize the militia organization known as the Volunteer Training corps as part of the military forces of the country solves a difficulty that for many months threatened to wreck the whole volunteer home-defense movement. The trouble arose in connection with Ireland, and shows how the old home rule quarrel persists even in the face of war. The Irish nationalists, or home rulers, saw that a bill giving official recognition to the volunteer forces would strengthen the power of the Nationalist volunteer force, which is a considerable body of men, all united with the intention of backing the demand for home rule with force, if necessary should arise.

Many British Actors Respond To Country's Call (Correspondence of The Associated Press.) LONDON, March 26.—There are now 1,500 actors serving with the British forces, it was announced at a recent dinner of the theatrical profession by Lord Derby, who raised England's big volunteer army, paid the members of the profession a compliment for the assistance they had given in his recruiting campaign when he said: "Nobody knows better than I do how much recruiting owes to the dramatic and variety professions. One had never to appeal to them in vain. They always have been ready to give their services, and much to do them for the success that has attended the voluntary recruiting."

War Causes Death Of Paris Lawyers

(Correspondence of The Associated Press.) PARIS, March 26.—The Parisian bar has been reduced to its lowest terms by drafts upon it for military service. There are no longer any of the younger members left. It was a young lawyer, or "stagiaire," as he is called, who was assigned to the defense of accused persons who had no counsel. Monsieur Henri Robert, head of the Order of Advocates of Paris, who chooses these officially designated counsel, was obliged the other day to call upon Monsieur Ernest Cartier, 55 years old, formerly at the head of the Order of Advocates himself, to defend a man accused of a trivial offense.

AMERICAN TROOP TRAIN IS DERAILED IN MEXICO

EL PASO, Tex., March 26.—Word that two box cars or coaches had toppled from the track of the Mexican Northwestern railway, and that several American soldiers were injured, was brought here today by Bruce McKellar and his wife, who came in on a belated train, that left Pearson, Mex., last Thursday. McKellar said that a defective rail was the cause of the accident. The train was said to be carrying American troops to Madera.
