Possibilities of International and three months, thank per cent. Industrial Crises Prove Disadvantages.

SESSION IS PROFESSIONAL ONE

NEW YORK, March 27.—Fears of another great international crisis resulting from the active renewal of submarine warfare in European waters, disconcerting reports resarding the progress of events in Mexico and the possibility of a nation-wide railroad strike constituted the chief disadvantages under which today's alugated and professional market labored. Prices of important stocks yielded one to three points in the foremoon and some specialties suffered greater losses. Positings at that particular period were sufficiently broad to sugest further liquidation, especially in the war shares and affiliated issues. Recessions were grad-

dation, especially in the war shares and affiliated issues. Recessions were gradual, but nonetheless effective, and support seemed to be lacking except at marked concessions. Further ground for discouragement was found in the continued aloofness of the investment public.

The list strengthened in the dull final hour, when rails, notebly Western Maryland issues. Reading, New York Central and other stocks rose appreciably on moderate demand. Western Maryland preferred made an extreme advance of 2 to 49, placing that stock within easy range of its maximum of last year.

There were full recoveries, and in a number of instances actual gains, among stocks that showed greater heaviness in the morning. Mexican Petroleum, United States Industrial Alcohol, Raidwin Locemotive and Sugars helped to sustain the market at its irregular close, skewise Steel and Mercantile Marine preferred.

Total sales of stocks amounted to 52,000 shares. Moderate purchases of the international list were reported for account of London, but the inquiry from that source was offset by selling for Dutch interests which may have represented German foliams. Foreign exchange on London and principal continental points showed no material change from last week's closing rates.
