OMAHA, March 30, 1916. Receipts of all grains were good today and there was an active demand for all cereals on the list. The cash wheat market was especially active and ranged from 10 to 12c higher. The demand for wheat was excellent and the bulk of the offerings were readily sold on the advance.

Corn ranged generally from unchanged to 1/2c higher. Yellow corn sold at premium but the demand for the white and mixed corn was also very good. The demand for oats was quite active, the market selling from unchanged to 1/2c higher. Hye and barley were in good demand and both of these commodities were sold at unchanged prices.
