

HOLIDAY TURKEYS WILL NOT BE FAT

Frequent Rains, it is Explained, Cause for Thin Condition of Thanksgiving Bird.

RETAIL PRICE STILL IN DOUBT

Turkeys coming on the market for Thanksgiving have thus far been something of a disappointment this year as few of them are actually fat.

No, for once the war is not the cause of this. Strange, but it was possible to fix the blame for this condition upon Europe. The heavy rains instead are blamed, as turkeys do not bustle over the fields and meadows during the rain as they do in dry weather.

Turkeys of the common grade are at present quoted at 24 cents a pound whole, while the fat ones, few as they are, are quoted at 25 cents wholesale. Local dealers are hesitating to quote a retail price for next week, as they say they will not sell just what they will be able to sell, depending upon what the wholesaler will be asking for them at that time.

Cranberries are 24 cents a quart. Ducks will be selling for about 20 cents a pound. Geese are to be quoted at about 18 cents. Chickens will be 16 1/2 cents a pound, and bulk orders for dressing will be about 15 cents a pound.

If anyone feels like substituting pork chops for turkey, he will have the consolation of hearing that pork has dropped 20 a hundred. Chops are selling for 17 1/2 cents a pound.

Loins Steaks Cheaper.

Round steak is up 11 a hundred, with rounds selling at 17 1/2 cents a pound, whereas sirloin is selling at 20 cents that sold for 20 cents a week ago. Porterhouse that sold for 26 cents a week ago is down to 24 cents. Lamb is steady.

Cabbage is selling still at 1 cent a pound and of the finest solid Wisconsin variety. Potatoes are 60 cents a bushel, or 15 cents a peck. Squash is 3 cents a pound. Red onions are 1 cent a pound. Celery can be had in bunches for a dime. Grapefruit is quite abundant at present. They sell for 5, 5 1/2, 7 1/2 and 10 cents apiece, according to size. Lemons are 15 to 20 cents a dozen. Oranges are 40 and 50 cents a dozen. Christmas Golden apples are 25 a bushel box. Tokay grapes are 40 cents a basket. Common cooking apples range from 15 cents a peck up.
