

Scarcity of Best Material in East In Picking Teams

THE eastern football season finds a wide variance of opinion among followers of intercollegiate play regarding the final rating of the leading eleven and the players to be selected for the mythical all-eastern team. Certain players, such as Barrett of Cornell and Mahan of Harvard, are being mentioned for other positions a half dozen candidates are put forward, all having excellent claims for consideration.

High class back field material is abundant as well as heavy, powerful men for the center of the line, but there was a scarcity of brilliant ends and quarterbacks. Soney, Harvard; Lamberton, Princeton; Higgin, Pennsylvania State; Shelton, Cornell, and Stewart of Colgate, all have their backers for the wing tip positions. At tackle Gilman of Harvard is the popular choice, with Abell, Colgate; Schultz, Washington, and Lee, Farnam, Brown, Nash, Rutgers, and McLaughlin of Dartmouth in the running.

For guards, Spear, Dartmouth; White and Echlachter, Syracuse; Hoag, Princeton, and Black of Yale are the leading candidates. At center, Beck, Pittsburgh, is the player most frequently mentioned, although Cool, Cornell; Bennett, Princeton, and McEwan, Army, also are the recipients of much attention.

Barrett of Cornell, is the logical quarterback, while Mahan of Harvard leads in the race for the position. There is not the same unanimous opinion regarding the two halfbacks.

Hastings, Pittsburgh; Wilkinson, Syracuse; Oliphant, Army; King, Harvard; Tolman, Rutgers; Perryman, Pennsylvania State; Ross, Syracuse; Scovill, Yale; Gillo, Colgate, and many others are offered as suitable material. While

NEW YORK ANTI-ALIEN LABOR LAW IS VALID

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29.—The New York anti-alien labor law of 1907 under which it was made compulsory to employ only citizens in the construction of public works, was today held constitutional by the supreme court.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 29.—The anti-alien labor law, which was held constitutional by the United States supreme court today, is not in effect in this state today. Shortly after the state court of appeals held it constitutional last February, the legislature passed an amendment which permitted the employment of aliens on public works when American citizens were unavailable.
