DECLINE IN U. S. STEEL. Young Man Arrested on Charge of Attempting Assault on Child.

MOTHER WITNESSES ATTACK. Caught while struggling with little Lena Heniszy, 6-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. Heniszy, proprietors of the Roosevelt hotel at 215 N. 3rd street, Stephen Frank was later arrested by Detectives Gillen and Allen of the local force on complaint of the mother of the child and charged with attempted assault.

While Mrs. Heniszy, who was home alone with her three children, went out in the back yard to gather some kindling for the kitchen fire, Frank, who is a boarder at the hotel, entered the kitchen and engaged the children in a conversation. When the mother of the child returned, she was horrified to find the boarder attacking the innocent child.

Frank hurriedly fled when Mrs. Heniszy appeared. The woman immediately called the police and thirty minutes later Detectives Gillen and Allen had the man under arrest at the police station. The child, the oldest of the three, was taken to the office of Dr. E. F. Shanahan, who found that she required immediate attention.

At the Stock Yards' Employees dance at twenty-fourth and J streets, Saturday evening, two overcoats belonging to persons who attended were stolen. The management of the dance has succeeded in detecting who the parties who stole the property are and has given warning that unless they are handed over at the yards office today they will be arrested and prosecuted. It is the intention of the yards company to avoid prosecution of the thieves.

Defiantly asserting that she will not return to her former husband, Constantine Hernandez, Mexican resident of Grand Island, Mrs. Ramona Hernandez is being held under arrest at the local police station charged as a suspicious character. When the news came by messenger from Grand Island Saturday that her real husband whom she married while living in Mexico a year back, had sent for her, thinking that she was being enslaved as the wife of Guadalupe Eredia, local Mexican railroad hand, local police headed by Sergeant James Sheehan made the arrest.

Mrs. Hernandez told local police that her marriage to her first husband in Mexico is not binding. She said that she was never legally married to her present husband and would rather continue to live with him. She has three children by her first husband, while Eredia, who is said to have a wife in Mexico, is the father of two more. The couple have been living in a boxcar in Albright. They will probably be turned over to Grand Island police awaiting investigation.
