Good Snowfall Also Comes to Delight the Hearts of the Farmers.

WEATHER SOON CLEARED UP

According to the morning weather reports to the railroads, the Missouri valley, especially that portion in the vicinity of Omaha, was the banana belt of the central section of the country Thursday and during the night. At no place in the valley, according to these reports, did the temperature touch zero, though out in the state in many localities it went far below, the night being recorded as the coldest since last winter. So far as Nelwaska was concerned

Ericson was the banner apot for cold.

There during the night the mercury went

down to 6 degrees below zero, with Cor-

tis, Madrid and Sidney reporting 4 below. It was 2 below at Randolph, with nomerous places reporting zero. Generally out in the state the readings reported to the railroads were 2 to 18 above zero. The weather out in the state cleared during the night and this morning everywhere it was clear, calm and cold. Dur ing a greater portion of Wednesday snow was general over the state, accompanied by some wind, but not enough so that the drifting interfered with traffic. All along the Union Pacific, from Fremont to beyond North Platte, the anowfall Thursday ranged from four to ax inches, making pretty fair sleighing. Up through the Northwestern country, into South Dakota and out into Wyomin; there was about the same amount of snow, while south along the Burlington lines it was a little lighter, with a still heavier fall through eastern Colorado and northern Mansas.
