LONDON, Dec. 17-A Reuter dispatch from Petrograd says the Russian finance minister has prepared a bill providing for a general increase in direct and indirect taxation. It is expected to result in an increase in revenues of 636,000,000

rubles annually. Under this plan the income tax is to undergo a progressive increase. All industrial and land taxes, as well as stamp duties, are to be augmented.


