KAISER'S NEXT BLOW

MAY BE AT LONDON. British Paper Considers Tauton Attempt to Invade England as Possibility.

ALLIES AWAIT FOE'S MOVING

LONDON, Dec. 19.—During the relaxation in all the offensive campaigns except the Italian pressure on the Austrians, which has followed the expulsion of the Serbians from their own country, European interest is focused upon the probabilities of some new, but as yet undeveloped upheaval.

May Attack Canal.

There is much discussion in Great Britain of a reported Turkish-German attack upon the Suez Canal. Messages received from neutral countries professing to have German sources of information describe the German field marshal, Von Der Goltz, as equipping at Aleppo an army for an invasion of Egypt.

Officers returning from the western front express the belief that fighting there on a big scale is impossible because of the mud and altogether in worse condition than last year.

Germany has lost the small cruiser Bremen and a torpedo boat in the Baltic Sea through a submarine attack. It is presumed that the submarine was one of the English under-sea squadrons which recently has shown enterprise in these waters.

The Turks claim to have sunk a British monitor in the Tigris river near Kut-E-Amara.

Greek Situation Unchanged.

The Greek situation remains unchanged. The Greek government is reported to have protested formally against the entente allies fortifying outside Saloniki. This protest may be of the same character as the one lodged against the first landing of troops, which was then described as merely a technical one to keep the record clear.

Henry Ford's peace party arrived in Christiania this morning and was welcomed informally by professors and clergymen and the American minister. Notwithstanding the fact that the party has no official status, Norwegian hospitality and the warm friendship of the Norwegians towards Americans assure the peace party an interesting sojourn during their three days' stay in that country.

Field Marshal French issued an urgent appeal to the British army in France prior to his turning to General Douglas Haig. In it he asserted the conviction that a glorious ending to their efforts was not far distant.

The earl of Derby, director of recruiting, today told a London audience that he had found the heart of the country was waiting. He predicted a victory for the entente allies, an end to the war in many persons expect. The recruits mobilized under the earl of Derby's plan have already been drilling in several cities so that they may have some military schooling when they are formally called to arms.

English Heart Right, Says Earl of Derby

LONDON, Dec. 20.—Lord Derby, director of recruiting, and Ben Tillett, secretary of the Dock Workers' union, appeared on the same platform in a music hall meeting here today. The earl of Derby said:

When it comes to the question of the number of men who have enlisted, I must not anticipate in any way what will be said Tuesday by the prime minister. I think the country will feel when he makes that statement that the heart of the country is right.

"I hope the new year will show a brighter outlook than is discernible at the present moment. Probably the result will come sooner than many expect, but not sooner than they hope—a result which will be a victory for the allied forces. I am not the least pessimist about the future."
