SCHOOL DEBATERS TO TALK OF ARMS

Preparedness Will Be Subject of Arguments of Nebraska High School Leagues.

NINETY SCHOOLS TO TAKE PART

LINCOLN, Neb., Dec. 25.—(Special)—The Ninth annual debate of the Nebraska High School Debating League, which began in February and end with the state competition at the University of Nebraska on High School Debate day in May will be on the live question of increased armament.

This question will be thrashed out in some ninety schools in all parts of the state under the auspices of the largest debating league in the country. League was organized with thirty members in 1908. In each district the members are paired for the first-series debates, the winners then go into the second-series, and the two winners there then meet to decide the district championship—whose school shall have the state debate.

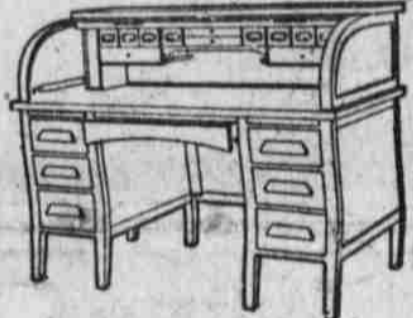

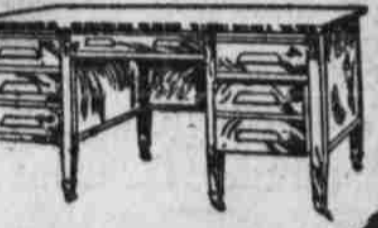
