TRAGEDY SWELLS LONG ROLL

May 7, 1915, stands out in the death roll of world-wide notables as April 15 looms large in the roster of distinguished dead of 1912. In one respect the tragedy of the steamship Lusitania resembles the melancholy doom of the Titanic. Both carried a large number of distinguished passengers, most of whom perished—1,100 in the Lusitania and 1,500 in the Titanic.

Rich American Expatriate at Last Realizes Ambition Nursed for Years and Years.

LONDON, Jan. 1.—Among the honors conferred by King George at the New Year are the following:

Barons—William Waldorf Astor, Lord Charles Bessborough, Sir Alexander Henderson, Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, David A. Thomas and Captain Cecil William Norton.

Among those who receive baronetcies are Vice Admiral Sir Frederick C. D. Sturdee, Sir William Goschen, Sir Charles Johnston and Alfred Booth.

The privy councillors named include William Crooks and Sir Frederick Banbury.

Baronetcies are made Knights of the Garter. Lord Mersey is elevated to the rank of viscount.
