

NEW RAIL RATES ARE ANNOUNCED

Increased Interstate Fares to Go Into Effect in West on Fifteenth of January.

NO RAISE TO WESTERN COAST

The passenger departments of the railroads have received their tariffs, showing what the passenger fares will be on and after January 15, when the advance in rates from 2 to 2.4 cents per mile becomes effective on interstate business, in accordance with the recent decision of the Interstate Commerce commission. The advance does not apply in intra state business, being only on tickets sold into states where the local laws provide for a charge of 2 cents per mile.

Under the decision of the Interstate Commerce commission there is an advance into all central and southern territory and west to a point as far as Huntington, Ore., on the Union Pacific and Reno, Nev., on the Southern Pacific. From these points west there will be no advance on tickets sold from Missouri river points.

To give an idea of what the advance amounts to to the person who is going to travel a few of the old and new rates are given on tickets from Omaha.

Save on Street Cars

Local railroad men assert that the fact of there being a wagon bridge connecting Omaha and Iowa is going to materially reduce the Omaha sales into Iowa. A party going to any town into Iowa can make considerable of a saving by riding a street car to Council Bluffs and there buying a ticket to destination, for the reason that it will be sold on the intrastate basis of 2 cents per mile. As an illustration, under the new order of things, a party going to Marshalltown, Ia., going from the Union station, would pay \$4.80 for a ticket. Should the same party conclude to go to Council Bluffs on the street car this fare would be 39 cents and the railroad fare from there to Marshalltown, \$3.85, which added to the carfare would be a total of \$4.05. Thus the saving would be 92 cents on a single ticket. What applies on the fare to Marshalltown applies equally the same to all other Iowa points.

"Ex-President Taft will be appointed to succeed Lamar as a supreme court justice," said a prominent Omaha attorney. "I base my belief on what I had previously heard would happen if a vacancy occurred."

If Mr. Taft is appointed, he will be the first ex-president to go to the supreme bench. The supreme court is now made up of comparatively new justices. Chief Justice White is the oldest and has served twenty-two years. McKenna has served sixteen and Holmes twelve years. None of the others has been on the bench over six years.

Some of the justices in years past served very long periods. Bushrod Washington was a supreme court justice thirty-one years; John Marshall, thirty-four years; William Johnson, thirty-one years;
