The hose will cost approximately \$8,000. This new equipment will be paid for with money received from a special levy authorized by the last legislature, and which will be in effect for five years, beginning with 1916.

Judge Sullivan of the law firm of Sullivan & Rait explains that if congress allows the appropriation asked by President Wilson, account of the Greek riots in South Omaha in 1908, settlement will be made through the Greek charge d'affaires at Washington.
