

OVER THE MERGER

Budget Situation is All-Absorbing Topic Since Governor Issues Proclamation.

SOUTH OMAHA DEAL INVOLVED

News that the governor's Greater Omaha proclamation was mailed to the city clerk had the effect of stirring the city commissioners to increased interest regarding the consolidated budget situation.

Superintendent Butler of the department of public accounts and finances conferred with City Attorney Rine on the subject of the forthcoming levy. While the city officials have a general idea as to the operations of the merger law, there are some details not yet definitely decided.

On the face of things, it appears that South Omaha will escape taxation for the last five months of this year, as the levy which South Omaha would have made next month and which would have been available to the extent of 10 per cent on August 1 will not be made under the

Increase in Levy. Within the next ten days the regular Omaha levy to cover the 1916 budget will be certified to in the regular way. The merger law provides that this certification may include amounts equal to the existing maximum levies allowed in South Omaha and Dundes, Under a recent legislative enactment Omaha may levy up to \$1,310,000 for general purposes, these increases being made over the last allowances: Police, \$30,000; parks, \$30,000; library, \$20,000; fire, \$20,000; sinking fund, \$55,000. It is probable that the full maximum will be made for the Omaha levy At the same time, the commissioners may certify additional levies to cover South Omaha and Dundee to the extent of \$317, 968.91 for the former city and 49,115.55 for
