Start Out at Eight O'clock to Look Over the Merged City to Ascertain Needs.

LOOK OVER CITY TOGETHER

The city commissioners were imbued with the spirit of Greater Omaha when they all agreed to go out with Commissioner Jardine to look over various sections of the city where improvements are needed.

Thursday afternoon Mr. Jardine said in effect to each commissioner: "Be ready at 8 o'clock in the morning and go with me to look over a lot of work and some of prospective work. I want your advice and I want to explain some matters which you will be able to better understand when the documents are brought up in the council meeting."

Every commissioner was on the job at 8 o'clock and at 8:15 they were off in automobiles. Commissioner Drexel caught the "spirit" of '15 and he, too, conferred with his colleagues regarding several matters which were gone over "on the ground."

None of the matters in hand was of any serious importance, but it was the team work which counted. In the neighborhood of Fifty-first and Center streets the commissioners agreed that the citizens in that section should be considered more than they have been.

It was agreed that the placing of a culvert at a certain point and some road improvement at a small expense would afford easy access to the street car line and would obviate a circuitous walk of several blocks.

Commissioner Hummel of the park department is taken with the Jardine plan of administration family outings and he declares that the starting time should be 7 a. m. instead of 8 o'clock. More trips will be made by the commissioners.

Women Keeping Up Farms of France

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) PARIS, June 7.—The success with which women have contended with difficulties of farming is indicated by a report from the department of Meurthe and Moselle.

Of 80 communes comprising this department, 115 were taken by the Germans and 111 of them are still occupied or are so close to the fighting line that the inhabitants have been unable to return. In the balance of the department women replacing men have succeeded in seeding the full acreage of oats and wheat in the commune that were not affected and 70 per cent of the acreage of the communes that were devastated and have since been liberated. There was not only a lack of male help in this work, but it was seriously compromised by lack of horses. To facilitate the work the government advanced the sums necessary for the seed and agricultural implements on anticipated indemnities.

The creaking, lumbering two-wheeled carts loaded with carrots, turnips, cabbages, onions and other vegetables, driven by men in capes resembling the Alpine chasseur's beret, that were to be encountered in the streets of Paris before the war, are now driven by women. It is due almost entirely to them that Paris is not deprived of the famous cauliflower from Chamois, the celebrated white turnip of Croissy-sur-Rouelle, the carrots of Montesson and the delicious green peas of Clamart, as well as the luxurious asparagus of Argenteuil.
