Reported for Assessment a Valuation Half Million in Excess of Last Year.

MEANS BIG INCREASE IN TAX

The Douglas County Board of Equalization, at its first session of 1915, at the court house, was confronted by a situation never before known in the history of public utilities taxation in Omaha.

The report, if accepted by the board, will result in an increase of more than \$1,400 annual taxes paid by the company.

The electric light company pleaded in federal court in the suit in which it is resisting rate reductions ordered by the city council that its real and personal property combined was worth \$3,500,000.
