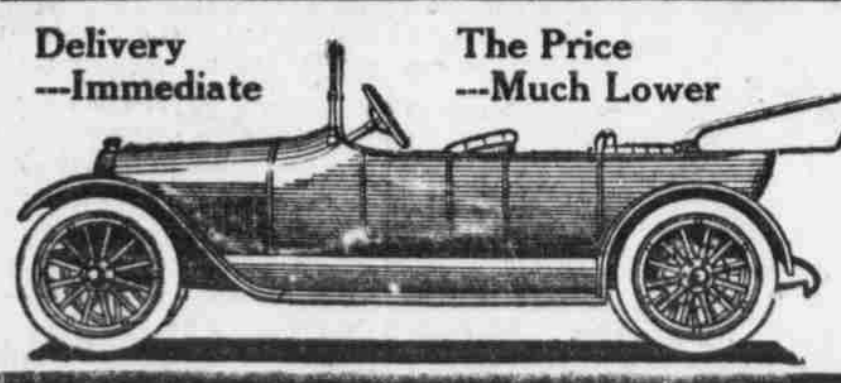
Meets His Friends. In the morning he was in his room at his hotel for several hours, and there met a number of his friends, who were delighted to discuss his prospects of victory with him.
