

### PIRATES STOP THE SUPERBAS' RUSH

Brooklyn Again Strikes Snag at Hands of Pittsburgh After Long Series of Victories.

#### FINAL SCORE IS SIX TO TWO

BROOKLYN, July 20.—After winning seventeen of the last twenty-one games played, having lost three and tied one, Brooklyn today again struck a snag in the Pittsburgh team, who had interrupted the winning streak by taking the first game of the double-header on Saturday. Harmon had the Brooklyn at his mercy, and Pittsburgh won easily, 6 to 2. Douglas was attacked vigorously in the first inning when triples by Collins and Wagner and a double by Hinckman netted two runs. Errors by Miller and O'Mara and three singles produced three runs in the seventh. Getz will throw on Collins' grounder, Johnston's sacrifice, Hinckman's out and Wagner's hit scored another run in the ninth.
