Breaks World's Record for Plowing Three-Acre Tract on First Day of Show.

FAMOUS FOR ITS LONG TRIP

The world's record for fast plowing was smashed into atoms on the opening day of the Fremont demonstration. The Wallis "Cub" tractor, of cross-country rame, lowered the record for plowing three acres with a four-bottom plow from 87% minutes to 77 minutes.

Coupled with this remarkable performance, was the fact that the land the "Cub" was plowing had a depression half filled with water across it and the plows had to be dragged through this. Other tractors filled their wet spots with straw and lifted their plows across, but the little "Cub" pulled its four plows through


